DARRYN GEORGE: PULSE Until 24 August, free

An engulfing exhibition fusing customary Māori art and contemporary abstract painting. Using intricate patterns, chanting rhythms and an eye-popping palette of red, black and white, George fills the white expanse of the Sutton Gallery with a continual pulse of light, language and pattern.

TRAVELLING LIGHT Friday 13 June - Sunday 13 July, free

A month-long exhibition timed to coincide with Matariki, when the Pleiades star cluster rises in the morning sky. Inspired by the vast journevs undertaken by early Māori celestial navigators, Travelling Light is full of star maps, sea journeys and night flights - from Shane Cotton's night-time paintings through to Lonnie Hutchinson's electric lightscape.
