Te Hāpua: Halswell Centre

Officially opened on 28 November 2015

Te Hāpua: Halswell Centre is a new library and community facility built in south-west Christchurch. It includes a library with varied spaces for a range of activities, several large meeting rooms, inclusive community spaces and a Customer Service Desk. There is also a 5,000 square metre outdoor area which includes a swimming pool. The Centre is an accessible, welcoming and inclusive community resource for all.



Length of construction

Construction started on site on 21 July 2014 and was completed by mid-November 2015

Situated alongside the Halswell Aquatic Centre, the building is just over 3,000 m2. This includes 1800 m2 for the library and 1,000 m2 for the community facilities

How was the site chosen?

The choice of a site at 341 Halswell Road, surrounding the Halswell Aquatic Centre, was guided by the consultation findings from the south-west area plan.



How did Te Hāpua: Halswell Centre get its name?

A community competition was run to name the new centre. 162 potential names were received with the winning name being 'Halswell Centre'. A te reo name was sourced from Tangata Whenua: Te Hāpua. This gives reference to pools of water, and a subtle reference to Waihora (Lake Ellesmere), often referred to as a 'hāpua' or coastal lagoon. The name also references the location of the complex alongside Te Tauawa-a-Maka/Nottingham Stream, an upper tributary of the Huritini/Halswell River, an important source of the lake.



Special design features

The design has slot shapes in the exterior walls, surrounded by glass where lush vegetation will be planted. People sitting up against the windows will experience the feeling of being in an "intimate oasis"



Special green features

The building has high natural light levels and passive solar design. Water from the roof is being used to irrigate the planting below.

119 new trees are also being planted around the facility along with substantial low planting in landscaped areas.

The centre has a high level of acoustic treatment and isolation, for user comfort.
