**Description** Margaret Mahy is one of the most famous New Zealand

> children and young adult book authors. Born in Whakatane in 1936, she moved to Christchurch to attend Canterbury University. She worked as a librarian in the Christchurch Public library until the early 1970s. Then she concentrated on her writing career and published world bestsellers like The Haunting and The Changeover: A Supernatural Romance (both received the Carnegie Medal) . While the plots of many of her books have strong supernatural elements, her writing concentrates on the themes of human relationships and

growing up.

Her novels have been translated into German, French. Spanish, Dutch, Norwegian, Danish, Swedish, Finnish, Italian, Japanese, Catalan and Afrikaans. In addition, some stories have been translated into Russian, Chinese and Icelandic.

For her contributions to children's literature she has been made a member of the Order of New Zealand. The Margaret Mahy Medal Award was established by the New Zealand Children's Book Foundation in 1991 to provide recognition of excellence in children's literature, publishing and literacy in New Zealand. In 2006 she was awarded the Hans Christian Andersen Award (known as the Little Nobel Prize) in recognition of a "lasting contribution to children's literature".

Margaret Mahy lives in Governors Bay.
