## LIBRARIES AND MECHANICS INSTITUTES ACT 1908.

## DECLARATION OF INTENTION TO ESTABLISH A PUBLIC LIBRARY. PART 11.

We, the undersigned residents of Linwood and its vicinity hereby make declaration of our intention to establish a public library in a building leased from the Christchurch City Council, and situate at the intersection of Stanmore Road and Worcester Street in the Linwood Ward of the City of Christchurch.

The library shall be called the Linwood Public Library, and its purpose shall be to provide suitable reading, recreation, and entertainment for its members by the provision of books for lending purposes, and the establishment of a reading room supplied with newspapers, journals, magazines and other literature for the use of the general public.

The amount of money and money's worth available for the purpose exceeds Twenty Pounds.

The names of the Trustees already appointed are George Warren
Russell, William Wilcox Tanner, and Daniel Richardson, and three Trustees
shall be elected annually, at the Annual Meeting by the members of the
Association then and there present.

Membership of the Library may be obtained by the payment of a half yearly subscription, and the approval of the subscriber's name by the Committee of Management, or a majority thereof.

The making of by-laws is vested in the Committee of Management, now elected, and hereafter to be annually elected, but such by-laws shall be subject to the assent of a majority of members present at the Annual Meeting.
