A Paper communicated by Dr. Rumsey of Gloucester upon "The medical Sanatory provision necessary for a newly-formed community" was read, and upon the motion of Mr. Wills seconded by Mr. Butterfield, the secretary was requested to convey to Dr. Rumsey an expression of their gratification of the meeting ^{of the meeting} thereof, and to invite further communications upon the same subject.
