- 17<sup>th</sup> Came out from Port with Mr. Went
- 18<sup>th</sup> Gubbin. to the
- 19<sup>th</sup> Dr. carting it off
- 20<sup>th</sup> Carting tin to off the land very fine weather - flat having cutting potatoes
- 21<sup>st</sup> Ploughing for potatoes
- 22<sup>nd</sup> Mowing the wheat
- 23<sup>rd</sup> Mowing Barley and oats.
- 24<sup>th</sup> Went to Potatoes Port
- 25<sup>th</sup> Received two letters from England by the Duke of Portland - bowed taxes and oats.
- 26<sup>th</sup> Ploughing for potatoes
- 27<sup>th</sup> Burning rubbish on potatoes land
- 28<sup>th</sup> Planting late potatoes. Harper digging swamps land
- 29<sup>th</sup> Planting late potatoes. Harper digging
- 30<sup>th</sup> Jobbing about
- 31<sup>st</sup> Fine day. dined with Mr. Phillips

1852 ——— Jan — 1853. 66.

- Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> Ploughing outside the fence - clearing ground - three hours heavy rain very acceptable
- 2<sup>nd</sup> In
- 3<sup>rd</sup> broke the plough - Wilson went to Port.
- 4<sup>th</sup> Ploughing outside the fence - Jeffs clearing
- 5<sup>th</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> In Port. Wilson Ploughing
- 7<sup>th</sup> Went to church Wilson child christened
- 8<sup>th</sup> 9<sup>th</sup> Ploughing
- 10<sup>th</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> 13<sup>th</sup> In port. Wilson Ploughing
- 14<sup>th</sup> Sunday. went to see Mr. Went
- 15<sup>th</sup> Planting Potatoes - Went to Christ Church brought three heifers £15 each
- 16<sup>th</sup> Out in the morning clearing land
- 17<sup>th</sup> Ploughing and clearing land
- Jan 29<sup>th</sup> 1853 up to this time ploughing and harrowing land for wheat - began to plough the second time on the 21<sup>st</sup>
