

Aug. 26 Went up to Ziguinore plain with Mr. Dullage & the son had lunch & came back for tea

Aug 27. Had breakfast & sent luggage off & left at 8, got to the P. Cam de Dault 10:45 had a quick visit & left 11:15. We found 6 miles of mud sand since he had been up but fortunately sleds had been made & it was a cold wind & we got along comfortably & got to the hut at 1:45. Miss Wedgwood & two guides & a dog Roy & his mother came later, & in the afternoon a woman guide with a man & a girl. No tracks to Mt. d'Heureux

Aug 28 A fine sunrise & beautiful morning light, we got off at 6 & went on good snow for the Dault & Doreguelais watching the other parties going to the Za, we got to the foot of the way up to the Mt de Dault. Dr. Doreguelais. The whole place was surrounded in mud & sand & we had a little discussion as to which was the best way up. We went up & sleep sand at first abt. 6 p.m. tests, then he found the mud sand on sand snow & later ice & had to clear it away & clear - as he was afraid of no return, as there was no union between the two layers. In places it was a foot deep & powder sand he got on to same rock. 8:30 to 10 & had a sunset & then sat standing on till 10:40, most of this usual in clay rocks. He was now well up & could see the ridge of the peak. It was plastered with ice & chert but seems possible so we returned & got down on to the flat at 11:30. We got a little shelter from the wind & had food & then went on to the Mt de Doreguelais, ~~at 12:45~~ we returned & got back to the hut at 2:30. The snow was still quite good, we changed our things and had to go to bed to sleep. There had been a cold wind & a good deal of fine driving snow & my face felt better burnt.

Dault & Doreguelais (attempts)

Aug 29. We got off at 5:30 & got along well on good snow till the last half mile to the Mt d'Heureux when it got deep & soft we got to the Mt at 8:30. When we came across tracks from

Zemett leading up the Jebi Dorech. We got to the Stodge at 9:15 had food & left at 10:30. In no place we missed the track. We were off the Stodge at 11:30. We went down to see the theglacis & got a fair view. Miss Doreguelais was on the Schenck and back just where it leaves the moraine. We stopped for food 1-1:45 & the first - came down stream & then stopped standing on & got to Zemett at 4. Had a hair cut & shave & then caught the 6:30 train to St. Hill (G. road Hotel & Rome) had a bath & then dinner

Aug 30. No night snow, no letters, but in room saw a night

Aug 31 Off at 10, glaucous & cloudy hills, along road to first large bridge, sign post to Topali hut, up steep path through trees came to water & went to bridge where the track crosses to the right bank of the main stream; we returned on slope about 100 yards to spring & had lunch 12:10-1:45 we went down to camp, it began to rain about 3 & we huddled for bit & then went home

Sept 1 he had arranged with one of the Kabeenaltas, but he came up to say it was not, so we slept on. After lunch we took train to Jambou & met Mr. Zemett, had tea, did some shopping & returned to train.

Sept 2. Informal expedition engaged as Zemett, so we got Karl & started at 7:10. We talked of the highest chert north from Zemett St. Hill lower station avoiding the long detour to Garsuried 8:10 & left 8:20 path goes up the hill & keeps close to good from the top of the side of steep descent to the Reed stream, the path widens when the one from Garsuried comes in. The path comes out on to an alp behind the left lateral moraine (8:20-8:30) just before the path rises on to the moraine we had food 10-10:30. There is no water from the highest chert till the plain is reached. At the end of the path there are good caverns above the snow covered moraine. We got to the Hut at 1. We had lunch & slept and in the sun & had a cup of tea. 3 distinct masses (Krauer & Schumacher) came up with the Hittewood
