

After another cup of tea I set off down a long wearisome descent. I had another cup of tea on the way at 6. Val of Guadalupe at 5.30 & stayed at the Hotel Hotel. There were several other units.

Aug 10. I decided to have a day off. I had taken my blankets & tried to get them mended, but the tailor was busy mending & the "Culicimicia" had just had their Curio, so I had to go to the tailor to get them mended myself. The rain was comfortable.

Aug 11. I set off at 7.10. It was very hot & I had many rests. I had lunch at the stream before the village & got to the Chales ~~from~~ Repye & across the river at 11. I had a wash in the river & after lunch went to sleep. There were several who were coming to La Berrade.

Aug 12. I set off at 5.30 & did not cross the bridge until it was ^{good} ~~from~~ bridge. As soon as there is a gradual glass rise beside the stream is the direction of the mt. I had to walk ^{at} ~~the~~ the stream & both of my stockings I did it. The track lead up the right bank of the stream & reaches the level just to the E. of a big rock which from the bottom of the Valley looks almost like a Chales. I wandered over the field & had a wash of the stream along the Vallumbrien Lake & then joined the right bank of the stream to the left & went up one of the shale ridges. I had a wearisome walk. I got to the top just W. of a rock slip at 1.5 & followed the ridge toward the "Vallumbrien" is a w. for a bit & got a better look down & went down a shale ridge. I got down to water at 1.30 & had food being 2.15. A grass field is visible from the Col with a path leading to the west. I tried to get down by tracks which led to the Col, but they were very steep tracks. I then took the good track ^{down} to the W & followed it along & descended & one by left down the bluffs till I got to a little grass field on the far side of the

Stream descending to the main stream I will follow the large grass field. Here I found traces of a path which I soon saw was not. I descended to the river bed which was too below running flat. I followed it along & just where there is an abrupt drop & falls lead out on the E. side of the river, I had to cross to the Chales Valley. I got to the river (D. Lac) at 6. I started at 6.15. It was very hot along the road. I got to La Berrade & stayed in ^{at Chales} at 7.40. After a wash & had food.

Aug 13. I had a very busy day. I went to the fountain to collect the water from ^(7.40) ~~at~~ 6.15. There was a Sunday & an anti-fur Chales at 7.30 & got to the market. I got in at 8.40. I wandered over of God & the market & got my letters. I carried the 1.50 & went on to the Dampier fountain. The train was unacceptably hot. I stopped at a little inn Hotel Hotel TR 22 6057 close to the station. The Dampier is about 5' higher away from fountain & the Dampier is a very isolated look. I stayed for a night in the Dampier & of course a time was. It was unacceptably hot the key to the pen and sleep of the Val of Guadalupe. After the Sandrine version of 1882 it was fulfilled of Vancouver.

Aug 14. I left my bag at the hotel from working & got on a boat to Guadalupe. The anti-fur on the Col de Vars was full so I shared a private anti-fur with a man to St. Paul de Val. The price I saw on the Col de Vars. Several arrivals in the day had crossed it on the way to St. Paul. From the summit of the Col there is a fine view of the Arguille & Bee de Chambeyron. I got to St. Paul de Val about 11.30. The hotel which my previous room & pet's doghouse was full - all meals and a small bed-room restaurant. I got to Dampier - Arguille & Dampier who kept a small inn. Chas Dampier - on the telephone & worked a man. After lunch I left off in the heat of the day to walk up. I had to go there all day long in the cold entrance to get my things sorted on the way and taking a break. I followed the road to Petite Serenne, I should have turned off.
