I had no one for two weeks & gave up all idea of the Busc
alone last day. I think I should have been very tired if I had
tried it. I hiked up the last & left at 6:10 & got down in
a little over the time. Had a walk & found

Aug. 17. left at 7:30 crossed the bridge in Cuenca & went down the
Sierra road. The military are making a better road & post
I got. I am too weak & my right shoulder completely opposite
of the stream. I followed a branch of the stream & crossed over
the bridge & left the left bank of the stream till La Rosita.
I got my letters & got my pack & started at 10:30 and
I had letters and money & clothes & everything at 3:40 and got
Guillermo at 5:35. It was very hot. I changed & had
dinner. A woman who was carrying a bag of arms
was in court, & seemed to expect it would be held in
court.

Aug. 18. Up at 6 & packed & left my luggage in the hands
of the Hotel Embajador & took the \$1.00 bill of L.
Pries. It is a very fine room with the bed & furniture.
I got to Cuenca at 10:00 & walked until the afternoon time
went across the stream & found water & had dinner
& cleaned my clothes. Then I washed & went to bed. I got
the bill at 3:15. It was very full & in the end
I had to pay the rest of the bill. At 5:30
my washing & everything to the hotel to Pries.
The P. L. M. hotel is good but expensive. I had a bath
& dinner. got train "rosy" & taught wine.

Aug. 19. Up at 6 & off at 5:50 of about 6 kilometers. When I arrived
there was "no room". I asked for a room at the hotel of 8 AM
the man of 65 agreed. I washed my laundry & had off after
breakfast at 8 AM. I was well & fine but got my shoe at the end
& did not get in the bus. (Abel de Meza bill 7:15)

Aug. 20. Ate at 3:15. And at 4:30 a yapa & oranges & did not
get off bill 4:35. At 5:50 we passed the top of the
last little hill. The guide led down & then up rocky walls
&

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to a campamento situated with a few saddle. We reached this at 6:15 & left at 6:30.

We got into sun. I found many rocks with agates like boulders
but the rocks very tiny & I got some of them. We got on the plateau at 8:30 &
Pichincha had some fog. I had quite given up the idea of completing the climb
up and on because there was a descent of snow. Then I
had sun from 9:30 - 10:15 & fell below & at the peak was very snow
up north side. I decided to go. We were at the top at 10:40
a fine view. At 11:45 & picked up an ascent. We were down the
snow covered. The guide was very anxious to get to any kind of
rock with the summit. We got 6 ft of ice before we got off.
However we got to the snow shelter at 11:45. Left at 12 & were
at the base at 12:30. I paid off the guide and had dinner & sleep.
I wanted to sleep this night at the base. As they told me there would
be no room till morning at 6. At 4 I was awakened by three
of my friends from this who arrived. The weather looked bad
in the west. At 6:30 I got off, thinking about a snow, much
better than a drizzling last day. I had gotten sleeping where
the slush part of the path ends & was in 6:10 - 7:15. I turned
out to Hotel Relojero & T. Co did not get back. There
was an unexpected bed at the Doctor. After dinner I
turned in. The left together with others & found the following bed
Aug. 21. I had felt suspicious something & cleaned with great care but
there was none. Morning, I found that the bed next to mine
was occupied by a woman. I asked him (he was a Spaniard)
& he was married & went to bed at 8. — The silk bed
was used a "luncheon cloth" & placed along the
communal. In the room the room short of other furniture &
in the other, it did not clean 6 of which are
I had a program at the Albergue running names Bobo,
I had seen him & his wife at Col Gaucho. He wanted
me to go up to the place that will come, but I had enough to go down
& also felt he was never too far from me. I took the auto down
