The rain ceased & stars came out. I was thinking of leaving with
my first walk this & was engaged to Cluses on foot.

Oct 12. I got up at 9 AM tried to take a photograph. I got several
good views of the town properly exposed especially of the Cathedral
from the other side of the river. I went up into the town & found
the market in full swing. I bought some cheese & eggs & climbed
up a ladder to get a photo of it. I ordered some films & had coffee
at the very market. I saw this alleyway for the 1st time
Sacred branch. I found I had walked off with a film!

After lunch I caught the 1.48 train to the Gygis getting there at
2.50. After looking at town in the Clo-Magasin - it too is in
Cliff dwelling for help the passage up stairs is rather long.
I went to the museum. very wonderful then to the post & back to the
hotel. My first looked rather nice it was gathering. I caught
the workwoman bringing back clothes & other things to give her mine.

Oct 13. I got off at 10 & walked to Tignes & saw the church & took a photo & then
walked along & crossed the railway bridge to Langyrie House. The garden
was away. I spoke to a man who was excavating close to the garden
house. He pointed out the Puyong. After he had gone I took a photo of the
walkings & of the garden house & the archway. I was able to see the
more interesting thing at Langyrie House - the street left & labelled
without sign. I walked on to Langyrie Dame which is called

wonderful amount of animals in any human house I have
ever staying at the hotel, he has done a good deal of work & was very
interesting & willing to talk.

Oct 15. I caught the 7 o'clock bus to Sarel, as gradually filled & was filled
with passengers going to the market. It was a pretty drive & we got
to Sarel at 8.45. I got my money from the bank. I saw the
Lantern du Mali & the Cathedral. The town was filled on
both sides as usual & had plain houses, the street on
both sides had a curious spiral & square masonry
rising up from the hills at the bottom & reaching the top on
the opposite side. Beyond the aisle which ran thro, were
