I walked on to Padriac & had lunch with some wine & a bottle of water & a glass of the grape & coffee at 12. I had some coffee. It is closed from 12-1. So I had to have a cup of coffee & a glass of wine. The coffee is so large like the width & the depth I was lazy & took the left down, then we walked along a passage beside a stream. With the wet weather it was pouring down & I was glad to be covered by the roof. There we got out of the road & would stay a while at the end there is a kitchen & a cafe. We got out & walked along a bit presently we came to a small lake & a boat below but there was too much water in the creek so we got out on the bank we went up to a higher lake. The St. Sulpice & St. Sulpice are certainly very fine. It is an enormous pond. It has been enlarged for about 3-4 km. but part is dangerous & very one can only go by special permission. I had to return to Padriac, there was a boat which he did not want waiting 2 hours so I decided to walk on. I got to Charente & the weather was a little better & I was able to take my camera off & then with the Rocheamadour station where I found a boat which was in the lake to Rocheamadour. I came on to the lake & I was glad to wait. I stayed at the Chartreuse.

I had a good dinner at the Chartreuse & had the 30p. Dinner & a very good dinner it was, but the Chartreuse was not too good to eat them properly.

Oct 30. I caught the 8:37 after waiting off on my bag to Pérignac & went down to Cahors. getting there at 10:30. I had some coffee & a glass of wine. It was a cold day with occasional showers. I took photos of the town & the Paul Valadier & saw the Roman Arch of Diana & got a postcard to St. Denis of the Cathedral. I was a part of the Benedictines.
