

N.Z. 1935

April 15. M.W. Set off to the Yacht & S. Peter, after having walked up to see how far our getting on. And took the back roads & tracks. Sure they were not "creeping" back to Hobart & walked as such. Decided to go up the W.C.-Ward Road and to start along the distance 15 miles less 4 days. Took the pack & 4 feed bags. New clutch plates. New dynamo chain etc £ 5.17.10. got off 4.10 went back & booked my luggage to off. It was clearly worth to get account in W. Ward & then I found the Jitiki Bay Road. Then over the PAKAKARIKI ^{a long way around.} Hill 760ft. Then down to see level & flat-road. I got off to Manawatu. 56 miles. The trip from PAKAKARIKI the way fine with Kapiro the Bird Sanctuary about half an hour. It was too cloudy to see beyond, but I saw it later on as the sun was up. Cloud cleared. got in at 6.20, stopped little here & there.

April 16. Tues. I got off and came, a hundred & ten. After leaving there ^{my top down} I passed the old river bed (flooding in wet weather), but it was of course still dry. After four or road about 8 miles for 20 miles, it was mostly below water. After passing the road rises off the Manawatu flats. I got to Waiparua at 12. I had some tea, called at the A.T. place, tried clay & steel called as Reddick Grey the same as Ross about 15 years ago. I left at 1.15. After leaving the Waiparua R. an rise of 3000 ft. down 1.30 miles again. The road was not very interesting, as passed in Bush & trees. The road less 1' 8500 above sea level when the snow was up, then down to 3000 ft. to Orange River Bridge, then went up 1' 550 above sea level & back down 3 miles later. I just got a glimpse of Ross' house full of trees. The country all the time was deep & the gullies deep cut showed up well in the morning & evening light. The road rises steadily to Rachiri 1665 ft. Then I had to see Clear Day, now M.V. like, temperature less little girl had light rain so I had to go in. I left at 5.30 & came along the road while rain started. About 5 miles out I saw signs of good cloud cover & back against the setting sun.

I hurried along steadily passing the Makatoto Narrows to last link of the Main Trunk Railway open in August 1909. Then I came up on 1- train plough. It was dark when I got to the junction so I went to the Hauhungatea Hotel there. There was 30 of us there including a party of 10 miners who had come for 1760 Club on Saturday. I slept in a small room with 20 others & the wash stand - 152.
 April 17 wed. I got off about 10.20 after being delayed on the train on the way to my sick child. Weather was beautifully clear & the glacier sloped well. I saw our light flats with yellow man grass. Ngakauwhau Channel & Waitangi to left, Steamer was visible across NGAURUHOU. I did not go to the station, but went straight on crossing the Waitangi River 2200 ft. up. The water was freezing but had to cross, recent rain had caused the dam. Pass Lake Roti Aria & son of Waitangi. I did not stop at 1.15. I waited at Taupo & I decided it was better to see the frozen ocean out at the glacier. I had enough time to do so. I saw the snow covered hills on the north & woodland & yet seen from rocks. Then a cup of tea in Taupo 32 miles from the fishing end. I followed the road to the river & had a walk of good 20 minutes. So I was at Taupō 6 miles at 8.50 off the Hotel. After dinner I was at the Kapiro Blow hole, saw all the safety rules of the Tunnel Regime. It blow like a 18kg wire & the pressure is 150 lbs to the inch. I had seen the same gun used last Taupo. 7.15.

April 18. Thurs. I kept a good time & often fully whipping some leading as the line went to the Wairakei Geyser. It was well with seeing. I took on a few photos, but will edit unfortunately. A film (Kodak) jammed in camera. Got stuck at 11.30 had some tea & I was at 1. Wairoa River, found there was a pub at the end of the big road so after sending some to bring road for water on it. Blew up tyres finishing whipping at the breaking, damaged the joint that all day, I had to use for all the Wairakei Geyser, as I did not know & could & had decided to camp near Wairakei on the grey water at 10 am. Very hot & dusty had to bath in pool. 32.4
