

N. 2. 1895 N. Island

1. I soon we could get the road down. I did not go after being sleeping. I heard him sleep through the night March 31st 23 miles at. However a certain amount of heat followed and the road was there we nothing to complain. Then the road became perfectly awful full of holes all along the road. I have never been on such a bad road. It continued to rain, 10 miles of perfect misery. It improved still, after Canfield it was quite good. Learned that I had broken one of the two rebound canaries. I stopped at the Glendale Hotel. & after him went up to see Doris Brown 68 miles from Rotown.

Hamilton

April 26. Th. I got up at 6:30 & was all ready for breakfast at 8. After breakfast I went to the garage & cleaned the car & picked up luggage at 8:30. Part of the road was fairly bumpy & rough however. But after St. Paul it improved. The road follows the White River for 10 miles. At Raynor's it turns to the other branches of the river. I stopped at Leo W. Powers Garage a very complete business & camp between St. Paul & Remus. The local clay trees had been used for the soldiers in the war. Had a very good time. Collected wood & got along well. & few little difficulties in finding "Shoreline". It was a very comfortable hotel. I got all my luggage into my room, took the car down to the D. Avenue Garage there a new scrubber fitted. Left by my alarm clock at 8:30am - & Dawson - Called at Whitehead & Vandyke's hotel & had dinner. Had a cup of tea, cream bacon & biscuits w/ my luggage. Met Dr. D. W. Thomas - a member of N. 2. & I saw him in Ch. Ch. 82 miles. I had 2 miles 2200 miles with S. Island apart from little runs & 530 with N. Island. Cutting 3000 miles in all.

Cleveland

April 27. Sat. I went over the town & got my watch from S. Lewis - & Dawson, & saw also my ticket & arranged about my

money, as I had transferred the balance of my account to Cleveland. It rained fairly steadily. I got my car from the Danner Motor who had fitted a new scrubber & found a garage near the hotel. I did some packing, went out & paid Leander - who was a German & English, however. I am to see S. Lewis - whom Amos Ames knew in Yellowstone National. He is a most cheerful man, in spite of his loss of a leg & the fact. As this he had been trained as an antelope killer. Game was his best hunting & a fine & happy all the antelope kills & antelope. After dinner I went up to Leander's & found him in a less & very pleasant evening.

April 28. Saw Steevey. Went to St. Paul, & to Lucy Avenue. 20-11 at St. Paul. Parked after dinner. Received 1000 Leagues or more after tea, last to garage was Steevey. Went to a cemetery at 7. & saw babies.

April 29. After breakfast took our train, bought fishing rod & various news. Nothing about our car. After went back to St. Paul, called on Mrs. Jaffot, & Andy Johnson nurse. Had dinner with Bishop Howell, met Mr. D. W. Ch. Ch. & then went to St. Paul's Brown, who was writing a history of that.

April 30. S. Meek (liver failed) And up Avenue 25 away of Cleveland. Went to St. Paul at 7. after lunch for dinner my washing had arrived while down & saw it - a word back to St. A. A. Lodge here Wright. Sailed at 11. China with 2 others. Took view up the Harbor & off the coast of N. 2. seeing much. Saw some porpoises.

May 1. Wed. Colder & had bath 6:15 - said nothing of before breakfast - saw big fish pub. a black fish just breaking the water. A fine day, very pleasant; just wrote for library & read. Drove bell chime in morning. Wonderful tropical clouds at 8 hours & often after dark, the light of <sup>his plants</sup> the stars - one star over the Starboard reflected on the water.

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
