

May 23. got up early & packed as far as possible. Went out into lake about 10:30 & worked to the top half. Still windy & blustering. We caught 4 fish & then went in for lunch. While the coffee was being it came on to rain & hail so we put on our macintoshes & waders. It was still bad after lunch so I decided to return & get my things dry for packing. We used a place on the way back & got 4 more, 3 small. I put my things to dry in the warm - hot - breeze. & after a bit changed & packed my things in some bag, wet dry. After tea the car came up for case & I drove down a very greasy road my car including a car both ways (12 miles) 5 days & 6 days for a man & wife was 63 dollars - say 12.00! The dog is very comfortable & the fishing excellent. Fish is May for fly - & again in Sept. - June - Aug is too high but it is dead even in Canadian prices.

May 24. I went across the Island for dinner repeated my luggage & turned in a public holiday in Canada to some Victoria birthday. got up at 5:45. had a cup of tea & got to the station at 7. Saw the cabin with 12 mounted & the saw-car & a car & gave a wave to the boys. It was again a cloudy & dull day, I did not get into the dam for the observation car. I had breakfast at 8:30. There was a little drizzle - also my ticked - but it came all right.

Soon after the start we ran along the shoreward lake to Secaucus. Soon after leaving Secaucus we see the Obelisk that marks the completion of the C.P.R. in 1885. Soon after I saw a bear when I reached Revelstoke when I got a cup of coffee & a cake. Revelstoke is the W. end of the Selkicks. About 20 miles up the train stops to see the Albut Canyon. There was a certain amount of light & I took a photo. We followed the Illecillewaet river which is a curious phenomenon. The scenery evidently was very fine so there was too much cloud & mist to see the tops. After leaving Glacier we came to the Curlew - several birds were out.

the old line on Rogers pass which was very fine but had one 4 miles of snow sheds. The line is single track but this turned out to be 2 double tracks. There are some high bridges - one of 312 ft - and deep cut-creeks. At Devernment the Columbia River flows to the east - very fresh air & fog to reappear at Revelstoke on the way to the States. The Columbia river was on the Caribou route to the Rockies. Near Golden is Edelweiss the Swiss village where the glacier lives in winter. There is the western end of the Rockies. The track was followed the Kicking Horse River. Then there is the Yoho National Park which joins the

Deer Lodge National Park. At Field the clock also on line & there is a wait of about 20 minutes. Soon after this we enter the Spirit tunnel. The water lake & 14 miles per hour the Great Divide the boundary between Alberta & B.C. Both the line & the road are marked & a road of gold. There is a small Lake Louise. The Chateau was at 7 pm, but there was a fire & air of 1- Deer Lodge & we drove up in the bus & miles to the Deer Lodge. While there May 15. There was a good deal of snow along the road was clear. On saw a black bear on the way up. After the 8:00 train we had a short walk & turned in. Deer Lodge is comfortable but a bedroom is 2.50 with breakfast. There are in a cafe.

May 25. 5:00. I sleep well & got up at 8 & had breakfast. Still very cloudy & looking as if it might snow. I walked up to Lake Louise with my gun. The lake was still frozen & covered with snow. The Chateau is a beautiful ghostly place a corner between a prison & a factory to look at. I took a few photos but the light was not good. I heard that last week they had a very heavy snow fall & had to dig themselves out at Deer Lodge. I caught the 1:15 train & got to Banff at 2:15 & went to the Homestead; very comfortable. I had a walk round & looked at the Zoo & saw in & unpacked & wrote letters. After dinner we had a bit of a cup of coffee.
