

For our youngest members.... World Book Early World of Learning

World Book has created an interactive learning resource developed by early childhood education experts for preschoolers and children in early primary school. This site consists of three interactive learning environments:

Trek's Travels: learn alongside Trek, an adventurous scarecrow and Taffy the cat, as they travel around learning about: colours, numbers, size, shapes, sounds, places, taste and smell, texture, opposites, and time. It also offers narrated stories, interactive games and videos;

Welcome to Reading: features 48 stories in four reading levels. Each reading level contains links to games and videos. It helps strengthen phonics, vocabulary and comprehension skills;

Know It: is a child's first online encyclopaedia. The content pages of Know It contain clickable question marks that display informative text. All text can be read-aloud by an online narrator and accompanied by word-by-word highlighting.

When a story has been selected in either Trek's Travels or Welcome to Reading, it will appear in the player window. The story player features three modes:

- **Autoplay mode**: The default setting of the player plays the story automatically, with read-aloud and word-by -word text highlighting;
- Manual mode: Click on play/pause to enter manual mode. Use the next and previous arrows to manually advance or go back;

Independent reading mode: By clicking on the speaker icon narration and word-by-word highlighting will be inactive, enabling users to practice reading at their own pace.



Kids are spending a lot more time on electronic devices these days. With Christchurch City Libraries you can be assured that what they are accessing through us is safe and reliable.



TumbleBook Library – online animated books for the kids!

TumbleBook Library may just be the tool you need to get your kids reading. TumbleBooks are created by adding animation, sound, music and narration to existing books in order to produce an electronic book. TumbleBook Library offers:


- Story books you can sit back and listen or read along at your own speed to old and new favourites;
- Puzzles and Games;
- Graphic novels including Geronimo Stilton;
- Math stories more fun than it sounds!
- Chapter books these combine adjustable text and colour with complete narration and sentence by sentence highlighting;
- Nonfiction books titles like: *Animals in Camouflage* and *Who Likes The Rain?*; Videos where topics such as science, animals and geography are discussed. TumbleBooks are designed to be experienced in either automatic or manual mode. In automatic mode, the pages turn by themselves and are narrated. In manual mode, the narration is turned off and children turn the pages at their own speed. The pause button stops the story at any time in order to practice story prediction, interpret pictures, discuss new words or encourage problem solving.


The TumbleBook Library is a fantastic resource for those who are reading independently but also provides support to students who require skill building. It can be used in ESOL and special education areas as well. All you need is your library card number and password/PIN to explore this new way to read.






































Askews - the best of British eBooks

There is OverDrive, the big flashy American one, Wheelers which consists purely of New Zealand content and then Askews which is primarily British content. Askews is not as well-known as the other platforms which is disappointing. Is it that classic British reserve that is its undoing? Its unwillingness to shout at the top of its lungs - I am here and I am amazing? In case it is I will agree to be its advocate and champion.

Askews has all the big names in current Brit lit such as authoresses Kate Atkinson, Philippa Gregory, Hilary Mantel, and Ruth Rendell. Then we have the authors Sebastian Faulks, Bernard Cornwell, Ian McEwan, and Stuart MacBride. All this literary talent and more awaits you. The fantastic thing about Askews is that you can borrow and place holds for free and never have to worry about overdue fees. What can I say, the library provides the cheapest entertainment during these cold winter nights. So if you haven't snuggled up with an Askews eBook yet, please do.







Access hundreds of popular eMagazines covering a wide range of subjects through the popular **Zinio for Libraries.** The eMagazines are replicas of current print editions, including editorial content, graphics and advertising. Many New Zealand titles are on Zinio too such as *New Zealand Weddings, New Zealand Hot Rod* and *Organic NZ*. Why pay to read these titles when you can access them for free at the same time they are released in print?


Lindsey Dawson


