
Te Hāpua: Halswell Centre

Te Hāpua: Halswell Centre is a new library and community facility being built alongside the Halswell Aquatic Centre site. The complex, fronting onto Halswell Road, will create a hub for the rapidly-growing Halswell community.



Rumour Control

A little birdy has told us that the current Halswell Library, which has been around since 1968, has been sold and will be turned into a pub. We can confirm that this rumour is not true, and that the building's future has not yet been decided. When Te Hāpua: Halswell Centre is up and running, the current building will go through the standard Council process — assessed, valued and if not required for any other Council purposes, sold on the open market.

See you poolside!

While construction's underway, the pool area is getting a bit of a facelift. This summer, you'll see new changing rooms, toilets and showers, a BBQ area, additional poolside seating, all set on some freshly landscaped grounds and partially covered by cool, breezy shade-sails. The Halswell Swimming Club building, which had previously been located above the pool plant room, has been removed.

Space for hire

Meeting spaces are available for a variety of social, educational and recreational activities, and we're taking expressions of interest. Take your pick from:

- Two large venues catering for up to 400 people (250 in one space with hard floor and 150 in the other carpeted area), suitable for mini-conferences, weddings and other family celebrations. These could be booked out together to make a very pleasant space for a function. The larger space with hard floor is suitable for activities such as dancing, yoga, martial arts etc. and the smaller carpeted space suitable for smaller functions and meetings.
- A medium sized 'business suite' for up to 40 people. This would be ideal for smaller community meetings or business meetings, and could be hired in conjunction with one of the larger rooms for a break-out space.
- Three small meeting rooms with seating space for six people, and one larger room seating 12.

All spaces will be bookable and available beyond normal library hours. Kitchen and function facilities are included.
