**Stolen.**

STOLEN from the Glenmark Station, Hurunui, during October or November, 1868, a bay cob mare, is now 6 years old, 14 hands high, star, black points, branded CP near hip, the property of James Dowds. A man named John Hussy, an Englishman, about 25 years of age, a stockdriver, is suspected, and is supposed to be in Westland.

STOLEN from the stables of the Racecourse Hotel, Riccarton, during the night of the 24th May last, a cart saddle and breeching, with common black buckles; a horse cover, lined with drugget; a dark grey Inverness cape, and a pair of driving reins—part brown leather, and plated buckles. The stable door was found by the owner broken in, and an old cart saddle left in the place of the missing one.

STOLEN, on 22nd May last, from Quinn's farm, Makikihi, a silver lever hunting watch, No. 42550, maker's name Stamford, the property of Robert Hay. A man named John Toby, lately working on the farm, but now on Buckley's station, Waitangi, is suspected. Description:—An Irishman, 45 years of age, 5ft. 8in. high, round face, blue eyes, sandy hair, whiskers and moustache, wearing ordinary working dress.

STOLEN, on the 3rd ult., from the dwelling of Thomas Hughes, Lincoln road, during his absence, an open-faced silver English lever watch, with small chip out of dial between the figures II. and III. (number not known); three £1 notes, eleven shillings, and four copper coins.

STOLEN, during the night of the 8th ult., the property of Charles Bowker, Timaru, a tin of kerosene, containing two gallons, branded "Devoe's." A man named George Coker, who was working in the vicinity, is suspected; described as an Englishman, 5ft. 11in. high, medium build, fair complexion, sandy hair. Still in Timaru.

STOLEN, from the yard of John Bilton, Timaru, during the night of the 10th ult., two linen sheets, one marked "J. Bilton," with red thread; and one linen tablecloth. Identifiable.

**Missing Friends.**

ENQUIRIES are requested respecting Thomas Clark, who was employed about twelve years ago as Turnkey at Ballarat Prison; was heard of in New Zealand, in January, 1862, and two years later, on the Dunstan Diggings, Otago; was formerly a soldier in the 26th Cameronian regiment, which he left in April, 1849, with a pension for three years.

WILLIAM DAVID BARNARD is charged on warrant with obtaining, by means of a false pretence, from Owen Stace, of Christchurch, a bill of exchange for £50. Described as an Englishman, 38 years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, medium build, fresh complexion, blue eyes, light hair, sandy whiskers and moustache, chin shaved, very prominent nose; Jewish appearance; dressed in dark Melton Paget coat, dark vest and light tweed trousers, black deer stalker's hat, turns his toes out when walking, has a peculiar way of rubbing his hands when talking to any one; for many years an auctioneer, and proprietor of Tattersall's, Christchurch.

JOHN BROWN is charged on warrant, issued at Oamaru, with stealing on the 3rd February last, from the person of Thomas Wright, carrier, of that place, an order for £10—since cashed by the offender. Brown, now supposed to be in this Province, is described as being about 17 or 18 years of age, 5ft. 4in. high, supposed to be a native of the colonies, stout build, fair or auburn hair, no whiskers, full face, very flash in his conversation, and excessively fond of gambling.

A WARRANT has been issued for the arrest of Cornelius Donovan, charged with wife desertion. Description:—An Irishman, 28 years of age, 5ft. 7 or 8in. high, stout build, pale complexion, dark brown hair, dark beard (whiskers and moustache shaved); dressed in dark tweed suit, has a slight cut on upper lip; a farm labourer, formerly lived in the Kaiapoi district.

RICHARD JAMES NORTON is charged on warrant with deserting his wife on the 17th ult. Described as a Native of the Channel Islands, a groom, 32 years of age, medium build, fresh complexion, blue eyes, brown curly hair, dark bushy whiskers, moustache inclined to be sandy; dressed in black cloth jacket and vest, drab coloured trousers, wears a large gold ring, engraved with a ship; has the appearance of a groom. Warrant filed in Commissioner's office.

JAMES M'DONALD is charged on warrant, filed in this office, with stealing on the 2nd April last, a chesnut gelding, since recovered, the property of John Bonar, Courtenay; he is described as being Scotch, or a native of North of Ireland, 35 or 40 years of age, 5ft. 7 or 8in. high, stout, fresh complexion, sandy whiskers, beard and moustache, full red face, bald on top of head, erect gait, was dressed in blue ribbed coat, old cord trousers, black cloth cap or blue quilted hat; was formerly in the North Island Militia.

The attention of the Police is called to the following Extract from "The Registration Act, 1858:"—

"13. In case any new-born child, or any dead body, shall be found exposed, a Constable of the district shall forthwith inform the Registrar thereof, and of the place where such child or dead body was found; and where an inquest shall be held on any dead body, the Coroner or Justice of the Peace holding the same shall notify to the Registrar of the district the verdict of the jury, with all other particulars required to be registered concerning the death. Any such Registrar shall make the entry in his Register Book accordingly, and the same shall be signed by the Coroner or Justice of the Peace by whom the information has been given."
