#### Stolen.

Stolen, during the night of 1st ult,, from the Meat Preserving Works, Washdyke, a pair of dark tweed trousers, cross barred, value £1, the property of William King. A man (name unknown), described as follows, is suspected of the theft:—An Englishman, 25 years of age, 5ft. 4in. high, medium build, fair hair, worn very long; grey eyes, in the usual dress of a labourer, brown felt hat worn far over his eyes.

STOLEN, from the Royal Oak Boarding-house, Christchurch, on the morning of the 8th ult., a pound note, a sovereign, and 50s. in silver, the property of William Wragland. The money was left in an unlocked drawer in Wragland's bedroom.

Stolen, during the night of the 8th ult, from the Ferryman's house at South Rakaia, a cash box, containing in all between £50 and £60, composed of a ten pound note and one five pound note, a £5 Bank of England note, a cheque for £5 4s. 6d., drawn by Neil McLean on G. G. Russell and Co., Timaru; the remainder in notes and gold. Dunford, who is ferryman employed by Mr. White, of Christchurch, left the house on the night referred to, and on his return in

the morning found the cash box and contents gone. A man named David Forbes, cook at the place, is suspected. Description:—Scotch, 56 years of age, 5ft. 5½in. high, brown hair, grey whiskers; dressed in duck trousers, tweed coat and vest, brown wide-awake hat; a station cook; has since left Rakaia.

Stolen, during the night of the 17th ult., from the Windmill road, a canvass horse cover, lined with green and black drugget, with two belly straps, and four holes for crupper strap, the property of William Mayne.

Stolen, on the 24th ult., from Packwood's Boarding-house, Kuiapoi, a pair of dark brown tweed trousers, with light brown stripe down side, blue necktie, and a three-penny piece, the property of Thomas Ward. A man named Thomas Kelly, a lodger in the house at the time of the theft, is suspected. He is a Londoner, 34 years of age, 5ft. Gin. high, stout build, fair complexion, fair hair, sandy beard and moustache, scar from burn on right jaw; was dressed in brown tweed coat, dirty moleskin trousers, and drab soft felt hat; carried a blue blanket swag.

John Byrne is charged on warrant, filed in this office, with obtaining from William Pratt, draper, Christchurch, by means of false pretences, two carriage rugs, one black plush, with small yellow edging, size, 1½ yards x 1½ yards, value, 12s. 6d.; the second, black on one side, mauve or red on the other, valued at 18s. 6d.; both identifiable. Byrne is described as Irish, 34 years of age, 6it. ¼in. high, dark complexion, grey eyes, black hair. For previous references see Canterbury Police Gazette.

John McKenzie is charged on warrant, filed in this office, with the larceny, as a bailie, during the early part of July, of an order for £35 Gs., drawn on Gray, Russell and Co., of Timaru, the property of Thomas T. Jackson, of Ashburton Gorge. No description of offender yet to hand. The order was prescrited by offender for payment at the Bank of New Zealand, and cashed.

ROBERT MORGAN reports that going home about 8 p.m. on the 11th ult., under the influence of liquor, he, when near the Plough Inn. Riccarton, received a blow on the back of the head, which knocked him down and rendered him insensible. On recovering consciousness some five hours after, he found that a one pound note on the Bank of New Zealand, two half-crowns, and the following articles—an under shirt, shepherd's plaid shirt, and a pair of watertight boots, which he had that evening purchased, had been taken from him. > Colonial Secretary's Office, (Judicial Branch), Wellington, 1st July, 1871.

OTICE.—Certain convicted felons having been conveyed from Western Australia and landed in New Zealand, in violation of the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of New Zealand, passed for preventing the introduction of convicted felons into New Zealand, and intituled "The Introduction of Convicts Prevention Act, 1867," it is deemed expedient to give notice that, amongst other things, it is provided by the said Act that no convicted felon, or other person undergoing sentence of transportation for any offence against the laws, nor any person who is or shall be under any sentence whatever, in any British Colony or Possession other than New Zealand, for any capital or transportable offence, nor any person not at liberty, by reason of any conviction or sentence, to reside in any part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or in the British Colony or Possession in which any such conviction may have been had or sentence passed, nor any person convicted in any of the Australian Colonies of any felony who shall have received a pardon or remission of sentence on condition that he shall leave or not come or remain within the Colony in which such conviction shall have been had for or during any residue of the term of the original sentence, or for or during any other period shall land in any of the ports of New Zealand, or come or be in any place within the limits of New Zealand: And that for the purposes of the said Act the expression "Australian Colonies" shall include New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, Western Australia, Tasmania, and Queensland: And that any two Justices of the Peace before whom any such suspected person shall have been brought, on proof that such person has come into New Zealand contrary to the provisions of the said Act, may convict him thereof, and at their dis-cretion either take bail that such person shall leave the Colony within fourteen days after his conviction, or may cause such person to be conveyed in custody to the Colony or Possession to which he or she was transported, or in which he or she was convicted, or may sentence such person, if a male, to be imprisoned in any public gaol, with hard labour, for any period not exceeding three years; or, if a female, for any period not exceeding one year: And that by the said Act heavy penalties are imposed on all persons knowingly conveying convicted felons to New Zealand.
