Note.—This Gazette contains the substance of Informations received in cases of Felony and of Misdemeanors and against Receivers of stolen goods, reputed Thieves and Offenders escaped from custody, with the time, place, and circumstances of the Offence; the Names of persons known, but not in custody, who are charged with Offences, and descriptions of those who are not known, their appearance, dress, and other marks of identity; the Names of Accomplices and Accessories, with every particular which may lead to their apprehension; a description, as accurate as possible, of property that has been stolen, and a minute description of stolen horses, &c., for the purpose of tracing and recovering them.

- 1. Police Gazette.—Communications for this Gazette should be addressed to the Commissioner of Police, prepaid; they must be of Police interest, or no notice will be taken of them. Officers in charge of stations are requested to report to the Commissioner of Police every instance of the non-delivery of the Gazette, and to suggest from time to time such alterations in the addresses and in the mode of transmission as may be considered necessary. as may be considered necessary.
- 2. Warrants.—Whenever it is desired that any individual, whose name is given, shall be apprehended, it should be stated in the advertisement for the GAZETTE whether or not a warrant has been issued for the appre-hension of the Offender. When a warrant has not been issued in the first instance, any subsequent report an-nouncing the issue of a warrant, should refer to it in the POLICE GAZETTE.
- 3. Names.—It is particularly requested that in all Informations, the names of persons and places may be spelt correctly, and written legibly, the Christian name being given with the Surname, and written in full, to prevent mistakes.
- 4. STRAY CATTLE .- No advertisement of lost horses or cattle, will be published in this GAZETTE unless they be Government property, but notices of horses or cattle believed to be stolen, will be inserted gratuitously.
- 5. Property Described.—The brands of horses and cattle should be imitated as nearly as possible, and their exact position given. In describing watches, it

- should be stated whether they are open-faced, hunting, double-cased, or half-hunting,—the term "double-cased" being reserved for those watches whose outer case is removed in order to wind; "half-hunting" implying a very small glass in the middle of the dial.
- Rewards.—No rewards must be accepted by the Members of the Force without the sanction of the Commissioner of Police. When such claims are made, a full report of the circumstances must accompany the application. They will not be allowed, except in cases where meritorious actions showing unusual ability take place, or when they have been sanctioned by Legislative enactment.
- 7. Previous References.—It is requested that in all reports respecting cases already gazetted, Officers in charge of Police, or others concerned, will be good enough to quote the date and page of the POLICE GAZETTE in which the previous notice has appeared, and, in reporting arrests, to state by whom effected. Supplementary reports of cases already reported, but not gazetted, should contain such information as will elevals identify the ease. clearly identify the case.
- Telegrams.—In telegrams, the use of figures must be avoided, and words at full length substituted. In forwarding the brands of horses and cattle per telegraph, it should be stated of what kind of letters, the brands consist, whether of Roman capitals, or in writing, Se.

Some time between the 29th December, 1868, and 10th January, 1869, the dwelling of Thomas Appleyard and William Keig, situate in Chester street east, Christchurch, was entered, and the following articles stolen therefrom:—One £20, two £5, and one £10 notes; banks and numbers unknown; one gold nugget breast pin, with a few specks of quartz in it; one silk watch guard; one silver pencil case; bloodstone seal, T.W. in Italian letters engraved thereon; one light check silk scarf; one hair gold mounted Albert, repaired with sealing wax; one gold nugget with hole in it; one English gold breast pin; some book markers; a transfer of lease of section 303; one meerschaum pipe, having the amber mouth-piece broken; a small looking-glass; one flowered white silk handkerchief, marked H. A. in red ink; one large square muffler, black and white; one small silver pencil-case, marked with M on slide, and three white shirts.

Stolen from outside the shop of Edward George, High street, Christchurch, on the 21st ultime, one pair of lady's boots, size, six, elastic sides, and single soles.

Stolen, from the person of James Donoghue, whilst in a state of intoxication, at the Ashburton, on the 9th ultimo, one pocket-book with elastic band, lined with blue inside, the initials J.D. marked on the paper within; one cheque for £S 9d., which cannot be described, but is supposed to be drawn by Mr. Greenstreet, on the Union Bank of Australia, and about twenty shillings in silver. A man who was in company with Donoghue is suspected. Description:—About 5 feet 10 inches high, between 50 and 60 years of age, grey hair and whiskers, left eye very bloodshot, medium build, dissipated appearance, dressed in ordinary working clothes.

Stolen, from the premises of John Comer on the 12th ultimo, whilst out drying, two blue striped shirts, one white shirt, marked J.C., one print skirt, marked J., one jacket, one chemise, one pair of drawers, three children's flannel petticoats, one inside flannel, three small white shirts, one white frock with insertion up the front, one white petticoat, three children's print frocks, two Holland pinafores, one worked round with crochet-work, and the other with scarlet Berlin wool, three diaper pinafores with worked bands, two white bonnets, one quilted white hat, two large white pocket-handkerchiefs, one diaper towel, two Holland jackets, with pockets, bound round with the feather stitch.

STOLEN, during the night of the 24th ultimo, from the farm of Mr. M. Carter, Seadown, Leithfield, about six chains of ordinary fencing wire, and eighteen wooden straining posts, 3 x 4, and five feet long. Inquests.

There was an Inquest held at Kaiapoi on the 5th ultimo, before Charles Dudley, Esq., Coroner, on the body of the infant child of George Dawsons. Verdict—Died from natural causes.

THERE was an inquest held at Christchurch, on the 6th ultimo, before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Arthur Hopper, aged 30. Verdict—Accidentally drowned.

An Inquest was held at the Sisters, Pleasant Point, Timaru, on the 20th ultimo, before B. Woollcombe, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Arthur Neate, aged 18 years. Verdict—"That deceased shot himself with his right hand, while in a state of temporary insanity.

An Inquest was held at Christchurch, on the 25th ultimo, before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Thomas Cook Martin, aged 27 years. Verdict, "Committed suicide while in a state of temporary insanity.

An Inquest was held at Akaroa, on the 25th ultimo, before John Watson, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Mary Jane Phillips, aged 2 years. Verdict, "Accidently scalded by being knocked into a saucepan of boiling water by a boy named W. Watkins, which resulted in her death.

#### Miscellaneous Information.

George Warr, is charged on Warrant issued by the bench at Timaru, with obtaining money from Edward Stephen Dunford, of Saltwater Creek, by means of a valueless cheque. Description:—A Scotchman, 24 years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, fair hair, sandy whiskers beard and moustache, beard scanty, medium build, chin short and broad, high cheek bones; wore dark grey tweed coat and trowsers, black wideawake; dirty slovenly appearance; a labourer.

Donald Campbell, alias McMillan, is charged on warrant issued by the Timaru bench, with "Larceny as a Bailee." He is a Scotchman, a carpenter, 28 years of age, about 5 feet 6 inches high, medium build, fair complexion, blue eyes, red hair, thin and of medium length, inclined to curl, small red whiskers and moustache, chin shaved, prominent features, large forehead, nose straight and pointed, medium mouth, thin lips, small chin, smart gait and appearance; wears dark coat and light-coloured trowsers, straw or light-coloured hat, with blue veil; frequents public houses.
