Stolen.

STOLEN, on the night of the 27th August, 1870, the property of William Stacey, of Hororata, two £5 notes, neither numbers or Bank known. John Thomas De Leon, who was employed as cook at the house, and knew where the money was placed, is suspected. Described as an American, 63 years of age, 5ft. 5in. high, stout build, dark complexion, grey hair, beard, whiskers and moustache, an old offender. STOLEN from the dwelling of Lloyd Jones, Avenel, Kilmore, on the night of the 16th August, 18 dessert knives and forks, with wolf's head for crest, a coffee pot, sugar basin, cake basket, water dish, cream jug, 2 cruet stands, 2 salvers, a butter dish with silver cover, cow on the stand, and a toast rack of silver, bearing owner's crest, the above plate in lilly pattern; also of plated ware, 18 large and 17 small forks, 12 large spoons, 17 dessert spoons, 4 salt spoons, 5 tea spoons, 4 egg spoons, a mustard spoon, 2 gravy spoons, a fish slice and fork, a soup ladle, a pair of silver nutcrackers, a silver skewer, and a plated lamp stand. Warrant against Henry McNalty, *alias* Scotty, *alias* Jack, supposed either a New South Wales native, or to have come from Scotland when young, aged about 25, 5ft. 6in. high, 11 stone, very thin brown beard, whiskers and moustache, shaved under the lower lip and chin, wore alpaca coat, light tweed

vest, backed with dirty coloured horse rug, a black hat. He talks much about racehorses. He is supposed to have gone towards Melbourne. Information dated Sept. 26 has since been received from Melbourne that it is thought probable that the property may be conveyed to New Zealand.

Inquests.

AN inquest was held on the 3rd ult., at Christchurch, by J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Olivia G. M. McGrath, a child of 2½ years, who was accidentally drowned by falling into a well on the day previous. Verdict accordingly.

AN inquest was held at the Sunnyside Lunatic Asylum, on the 5th ultimo, by J. W. S. Coward Esq., Coroner, on the body of Elizabeth Drury, an inmate, who died of consumption. Verdict—Died from natural causes.

AN inquest was held on the 10th ult., at the Hospital, Christchurch, by J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Joseph Hesse, aged 17, who died from the effects of a fracture of the skull. Verdict accordingly.

AN Inquest was held at the Half-way House, Ferry road, on the 14th ult., by J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of George Young, aged 35, who died from a fracture of the skull caused by a fall from a horse he was riding while in a state of intoxication. Verdict—Accidental death.

JOHN FRAZER is charged, on Warrant issued by the Christchurch Bench, with having on the 26th ult. deserted his wife, Annie Frazer. He is described as a native of Scotland, 24 years of age, 5ft. 10in. high, of medium build, with fair hair, light sandy beard, whiskers and moustache, and small features; dressed in a dark coat, light tweed trousers and vest, and light felt hat—a Shepherd. When leaving home had two black and white sheepdogs with him. Frazer will probably endeavour to obtain work on some of the Stations.

BETWEEN 6 and 7 a.m. on the 23rd August, a rope, the property of the Timaru Landing and Shipping Company, was maliciously cut.

DURING the night of the 29th August, a stack of wheat, valued at £40 sterling, the property of John Small, a farmer, at Lecston, was maliciously set fire to and destroyed. A neighbour named Michael

McPoland is suspected. Description—an Irishman, of 35 or 40 years, 5ft. 9 or 10in. high, very stout build, light hair, very little beard, whisker, or moustache.

DURING the night of the 12th ultimo, a rick of hay, the property of John Milne, of Lower Lincoln road, Christchurch, was maliciously set fire to and destroyed. A man named Charles Dobbin is suspected, and is described as an Irishman, aged 35 years, height 5ft. 7in., stout build, very round red face, brown whiskers, beard, and moustache, brown hair, worn long, of slovenly appearance. A small farmer, living at Southbridge, in the Lecston district.

On the 14th ultimo, a portion of a human body was found, about 400 yards north of the Flagstaff, at Timaru. It has been identified as a portion of the remains of Charles William Wallis, son of Richard Wallis, of Timaru, who was drowned in crossing the Saltwater Creek Lagoon, on the 13th August, 1870. The remains were interred by a warrant from the Coroner, authorising their burial.

BETWEEN the hours of 2 30 and 3 p.m., on the 17th ult., Nellie Yardley, a girl of 5 years of age, was indecently assaulted at Timaru by a man, name unknown, described as 5ft. 9in. high, dark brown hair and whiskers, no moustache, dressed in a dark coat, light coloured trousers, light coloured felt hat, with black band around it. Identification doubtful.
