Using the Learning Centres

Bookings

- Please phone 941 5140 to arrange bookings for class visits or equipment loan. We
 recommend booking well in advance, up to two terms ahead.
- Please arrange a planning meeting with Learning Specialist staff at the Learning Centre prior to your class visit.
- Regular weekly school bookings will be under review after term 1 this year.

Transport

- Each school is able to use four return trips to South Learning Centre during term 1, at no charge to the school
- Contact Advance Passenger Transport System directly to arrange bookings. Fax the request to fax: 385 2367. Please quote the purchase order for visits during February to April 2007, advised by email to LC coordinators.

General Procedures

- Please access the Learning Centres through the main library entrance doors.
- The class teacher is responsible for the class in the event of an emergency and is required to have a class roll on hand
- Advise Learning Centre staff if any of the students have vision or hearing difficulties.

Consent Forms

- Schools are responsible for ensuring their school internet policy has been outlined to and signed by parents, thereby visits to the Learning Centre will be covered under this Internet policy and a separate consent form will not be required.
- A new Memorandum of Understanding for 2007 will be distributed for Principals to sign. This is an annual procedure.

Printing Costs at the Learning Centres

In situations where colour printing is required, students are able to print **one copy per student** at no cost. Any colour printing in excess of one copy per student, or surplus pages printed in error, will be charged to the school.

Our colour printing charges for classroom use are: A4 \$1.00 and A3 \$2.00.
