Putiputi (Flower) Weaving Workshop







Pū Harakeke: Ōtautahi Māori artists explore the relationship between whanau and Matariki

Wednesday 2 June – Saturday 10 July

This mixed media exhibition continues the journey of Māori artists from Kohinga Toi, who share their experiences of Matariki in relation to whanau.

Pū Harakeke is a Māori metaphor for whanau, each layer of the Harakeke fan represents another generation.

Raranga (weaving), paintings and carving convey the nuances of whanau and Matariki, of new beginnings and of holding fast to the past; and of connecting to each other, whether through extended whanau or as a whanau of artists learning together and supporting one another.
