


WAHAROA TO ARAITEURU PĀ

Araiteuru Pā was built in Hagley Park as part of the New Zealand International Exhibition held in Christchurch from 1 November 1906 to 15 April 1907. Also known as 'the Māori pā' Araiteuru was a small purpose built pā or village, built to portray Māori way of life and customs. The waharoa shown was one of the major entries to the pā. It now resides at Te Papa Tongarewa, the National Museum.



The Gateway, Māori Pā.



POUPOU

The carving was commissioned in 1994 by the Council in partnership with Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu to commemorate the signing of the Treaty of Waitangi at Akaroa and was carved by master carver, Riki Manuel. The Poupou represents Rangī, Papa and traditions of creation as well as recognising iwi, their ancestors and all the peoples of Christchurch region. The Poupou was a key feature in the CBD prior to the earthquakes and will be reinstalled at Victoria Park following its restoration.

THE KAIAPOI PĀ MEMORIAL

This monument stands on the site of Kaiapoi Pā as a memorial of the former Ngāi Tahu Pā, or village. Tūrākautahi and his people founded the Pā and he named it Te Kōhanga O Kaikai a Waro, the slumber of Waro, a local taniwha. His descendants named it Kaiapoi due to the abundance of food nearby. It was the central hub of Ngāi Tahu at the peak of its time. Kaiapoi Pā is located 20 kilometres north of Christchurch.
