# Welcome to Te Hāpua: Halswell Centre Nau mai, haere mai ki



Te Hāpua: Halswell Centre is a new library and community facility opening in late November 2015 that will create a hub for the fast-growing Halswell community.

The Centre will be almost double the size of the extensive Upper Riccarton Community and School Library. It will also be the first time that Christchurch City Council has offered so many services to local residents under one roof.

**Te Hāpua: Halswell Centre** is a new library and community facility built in south-west Christchurch. It includes a library with varied spaces for a range of activities, several large meeting rooms, inclusive community spaces and a Customer Service Desk. There is also a 5,000 square metre outdoor area that includes a swimming pool. The Centre is an accessible, welcoming and inclusive community resource for all.

**Length of construction**  
Construction started on site on 21 July 2014 and was completed by mid-November 2015.

**Project architect**  
Christchurch City Council Technical Services and Design Team. The lead architect was Crispin Schurr.

**Project dollar amount**  
\$23.1 million

**Size**  
Sited alongside the Halswell Aquatic Centre, the building is just over 3,000 m<sup>2</sup>. This includes 1800 m<sup>2</sup> for the library and 1,000 m<sup>2</sup> for the community facilities.

**How was the site chosen?**  
The choice of a site at 341 Halswell Road, surrounding the Halswell Aquatic Centre, was guided by the consultation findings from the South West Area Plan.

**How did Te Hāpua: Halswell Centre get its name?**  
A community competition was run to name the new centre. There were 162 potential names received, with the winning name being 'Halswell Centre'. A Māori name was sourced from tangata whenua; Te Hāpua. This gives reference to pools of water, and a subtle reference to Waihora (Lake Ellesmere), often referred to as a 'hapua' or coastal lagoon. The name also references the location of the complex alongside Te Tauwaka-a-Maka/Nottingham Stream, an upper tributary of the Huntini/Halswell River, an important source of the lake.
