After ~~a great deal of~~ ^{some} discussion it was unanimously resolved that a paper ought to be established, and the Council was desired to make what enquiries they could concerning the method of establishing it and report at a future meeting of the Society. The Secretaries were also desired to receive the names of all subscribers and to send a circular to ~~every~~ ^{all the} Colonists desiring their cooperation.

The Chairman then called attention to a beautiful set of Communion Plate purchased for the future Cathedral by a few friends of the Undertaking and by them presented to the Colony.

He also announced that it was the intention of the Committee of Management of the Association to give a dinner to the Labouring Emigrants at Gravesend before the ships started.

The Names of Christopher Calvert Esq. and the Rev. Mr Jacobs were then proposed for election as members of the Society next Thursday.

The Secretary also requested that all subscriptions to the Zoological Department should be sent in as soon as possible as ^{from want of the necessary funds} they were precluded at present from doing as much as they could wish.

The Meeting then adjourned to Thursday Aug. 8.
