ships from England with bulls
- 23<sup>rd</sup> Killed the white sow
- 25<sup>th</sup> Sowed red wheat in the Gully field.
- 31<sup>st</sup> Found American on the apple trees  
killed them over with oil.
- June 1<sup>st</sup> Finished ploughing G. Denton's  
field

- June Promised to cut W. Simsdale corn  
for him next harvest.
- .. Plenty of rain from the N.E.
- 4<sup>th</sup> Brunsden, Wilkinson and myself  
settled arbitration at Gardlands.
- 6<sup>th</sup> Sowed four acres of white wheat  
in large field.
- 7<sup>th</sup> Threshed out a stack of red wheat  
for seed.
- 9<sup>th</sup> Sold all the wheat to Messrs. Dalgetty  
Buckley & Co for 7/.
- 15<sup>th</sup> - 16<sup>th</sup> Sowed G. Denton's field with  
wheat - began to plough at Wilson's  
for wheat - a good deal of rain all the  
week.
- 18<sup>th</sup> Wet nearly all day - cleaning up the  
yard
- 21<sup>st</sup> Sowed the 5 acres with wheat.
