The meeting opened with prayer,

The minutes of last meeting having been read
and confirmed, Mr Pringle was ballotted for,
and declared elected.

Mr Baynon withdrew his motion regarding
the duties of Office-bearers

The secretary then reported what progress ~~had~~
had been made by the Committee of Man-
agement in getting up the Convalescent
He also reported on behalf of the Committee
of Management, that the following
effect,

"That the question of removing the place
of meeting has been brought under their
notice, and having considered it they
recommend the Society to give them full
powers to negotiate."

Mr Gathue then moved, and Mr A. Newton
seconded, "That the Society authorise the Committee
to negotiate in the matter of removing the place
of meeting."

Mr Cox, moved and Mr Fisher seconded "That
the question be discussed this day week."

Mr Cox's motion was agreed to. Mr Cuff
