

I had a very good lunch & often up went to see the Chateau. In 100 years it's been a barracks but has been cleaned out. Some good Scll - Roman Mosaics discovered on lower level & Roman foundation. I then went round the walls - the inner wall & got a permit to photograph (5p). Then down to the Port and after a cup of tea & looked the few remains in the bass villa. Dinner at the hotel (with porters) (10) & went to bed.

May 10. Up in good time, packed, wound up the city again. Picking up my fricke work which I had left in a shop. I wandered around the Dices between the two lines of participants, & took up a two photos graphs. had lunch in the same place came back  
alti & caught a train at 2.10 - to Castelnauay 40 min wait then to Ceris 1 hour wait. the to Alt. stayed at Terminus.

May 11. Went up & saw the Cathedral of St. Patrick's Bazaar of Saint Clare  
I went up to the River passing the station of the Personen a Neder of Alte  
& then left to the Cathedral. The light was very patchy. I got one a few  
photos & then went back to the Cathedral. It is a magnificent place containing  
the St. Clare Chapel. I took three photos inside. Then crossed the Chapel  
& the choir & after looking round went back to the west end & got  
photos from the railway bridge, often turned went back & crossed the  
bridge & saw the Mercurian (now) back & away to return to Raths.

Rodz I saw a Shiloh Rodz & saw Andi for the time waiting so I got a left by bag & took my leave of andi. Stopped at the Bazaar.

May 12 Chell very cold, Aug took one photo in the town. Boarded train at the  
Cathedral & walked round interesting cemetery. Two stone  
Coffins of IV & V<sup>th</sup> cent. back for lunch & down for 1.10 p. Service  
I was taken of the Anti-Rodriguez road 2 Kilometers from the station  
to the main station, & of course my bag was w. there. Missed my train  
but the Chap in town had it sent up from Ruby Portillo's j a  
train coming thru. Replaced all my luggage. I charged & started.

Millan left - clothes & bed covered and cleaned & went up to Millan's got them  
10.20 W cut & had dinner

May 13 Up at 5 & off at 6 o'clock this, after breakfast we began to get better country but the hills do not begin to close in till we reach  
which is on the left bank of the river. After this the river de Durance  
at Nîmes we stopped from 8-8.30 & I was glad to get some breakfast -  
then we to St. Etienne, where I got off the road to Flora.  
<sup>crossing the Cévennes</sup>  
After walking round the Steane-lès-Vallois College, I set off back back  
& walked slowly down the right bank passing St. Chely du Vigan which is  
on the left bank, the fine cliffs of Pergaudries, & so few houses as  
the castle de Page are old castles of XV cent. now a comfortable  
hotel. After a sleep I walked on to Nîmes about 11 A.M. in all - about 4.30  
I went into the church and saw a crucifix of about XI cent. The aisle was  
6 ft. wide - the pillars 4 ft. 6. the ceiling 8 ft. After this my I started  
alone, my feet being rather sore.

14. Went to Man d' Y. 15 - a very stir - lower basin. We had a short  
place in the clear water as we had to sail for the river & the stream  
which he read. I got off & walked down. The limestone rock are  
of a red color where raw but weather gray. A ruined chimney  
on the left bank. Just before the gorge I saw a boat - a light & loaded  
& followed down the river back until a man after it. This is the lowest  
part of the river, then comes the engine & Damnes when the river  
seam blocked with materials. Below the gorge I watched a man  
driving his sheep across the river. He used one of the driving long flat bottomed  
boat. The sheep knew exactly what to do, they walked in without any  
fuss & crossed themselves across the boat - just leaving room for the  
shepherd to follow them over. He brought the flock up in 3 journeys.  
At the Vigne I had dinner at the H. Passier. The river itself  
is more open but the cliffs close very fine. There is a narrow  
natural arch right off from the river 25 m wide & 27 m high.  
I passed the big suspension bridge de Roche & walked on to Roche  
itself on the left bank - about 22 K from Roche. I had a coffee &  
candy & then at 5 o'clock up to Mayenne up the very fine valley of the Jante.  
I stopped to visit the traces. After dinner there was a  
procession with a band & church banners & flags, being  
the festival of St. John of Grotto.
