

Austria 1833 (Summer)

- July 7 After ten hours rest I got a taxi for the Pullman at 11.20 & found that the train was at 11! I waited till the 12.50. We gave me very little time in London. I went to the Club till the 11 o'clock train. It was very hot.
- July 8 I had registered my luggage to Bâle Aug., so I got it at. & took it in the train with me to Zurich. I had dinner in the little Restaurant near the station & got the 11.15 & went this to Landwehr.
- July 9 Since I reached at 3.41 am & took a slow train on 1- Olytlad at 4.21 getting there at 5.10. I worked up the hotel & went to sleep in the Saarjumin till I got some breakfast at 7. I got an auto at 8.35 off of 3 weisselstein in time for breakfast. I just went to Gottfried's shop - mainly mercury guide - & arranged for him to come up to Gengen on July 12. It came on train. I stopped at the Post.
- July 10 A fine morning, I had breakfast at 7.30 & got off 8.30 & walked up to Gengen having lunch on the way & stopped at the Hotel. I just expected & saw the Pres. Dr. Dailey who is president of the Swiss Olytlad Society & asked him to get me a badge. Big crowd of people in the hotel. Hitler had just c 1000 mark fee in border markers leaving Germany & Austria was suffering badly.
- July 11 A wet morning, I got off at 8.30 & walked along the bank of the Rhine & turned up steep stem slopes to my right. At 10 am snow - had lunch & returned. I had been near the bridge over the stream, but a thunderstorm came on & I fled back & watched the big cloud over - so wet. There is no did not last long & I got back & had lunch. I got - nail put in by brother & repeated a very damp morning. Gottfried telephoned from 3 weisselstein but I told him to come up. Myself off at 10.40 & got the Railcar at 2.20. It is too high over the glacier for any thing except

- the Schafkopf or the Rautenkopf. It cost 5.70 ft train & a wire rope bus - passengers not allowed. It came out later & snow, 4 hours in the trip.
- July 13 A bad morning & I was back to bed. I enjoyed about 7 hours off at 7.50 & went to the Rautenkopf, as there was too much snow on the Schafkopf. Up to the Rautenkopf at 7.55 & I walked one & ways & walked up the Spitzkogel at 8. 45-9.10.

 We had food at the Rautenkopf 8.25-8.30 & then set off down to Voralp & with a bell of 10 min got there at 11.2.
Spitzkogel
 We went to the Post & then lunch & went up sleeping on snow. We saw two & got off at 3.50 & walked up to the Breslau ^{2.55} hotel which we reached at 6.28. It is a sleep pull off.
- July 14 We got off at 3.30 & were up to the hotel for food the last part. Being pretty sleep. I had a sweet & then we went up the Wildspitze 6.45-7 & came back to our socks while we had coffee on the snow. 7.15-7.30 In setting on snow I broke my cap. I heard it crack & then we. He then walked on excellent snow to the Blockhugel just & descended in to the Vernaggl. G. L. Y trudged down on snow that was falling off of the ridges, & the Vernaggl. hill. 10.5 I got a pair washed & went to bed.
- July 15 A bad morning we did not go out. We had a hundred & 200 m to the Blockhugel & the Banckhugel hotel. A number of Austrian Students from Innsbruck came up & were a very cheap crowd singing & playing all games. A party of German Party "Deutschland alle alle" I refused to stand but is proud off such well.
- July 16 A drab day morning we walked down to the Blockhugel H. Spitz which also except for the Vernaggl. hotel to Vernaggl. Stairs alone 500 ft down the stream & means this descent in ascent of the clouds. It rained & snowed. A very pleasant party of 4 Hollander father mother & 2 daughters who were going next day to the Gepetalhause. There was a species of the Vernaggl. but who said man or 4, a cub housed in the room opening with an alien behind it.
