

Austria 1933 (Summer)

Jug 25. I woke at 2, but was not called until 2.45. I started at 3 & worked up the guide & the cook, but got off at 3.40. The snow was excellent, the ground clay well. I left the top of the Vernagelwand steig at 4.40 & with a short halt - got to the bottom at 5. We left the beginning of the 6 km foot path again at 6.20. The guide was wiped & was repeatedly sick. It was rather heavy walking here as the old steps were snowed up. We were on the top at 7.40. A party arrived from Hollen but & 3 or 4 parties were passing us. It was a glorious day. We left at 7.15 & found the snow very good & descended the steep bank below the Weißenbach at 8.45 & the top of the Vernagelwand steig at 9.45. We left at 10.15. Left this the snow had been very good, but it began to get soft & we got to the last 12 km - & tired. I had just had a walk without sleep in the rocks pulling my pillow in my backpack & sit down. I paid the guide & sent him down. I found Schloss ^{H. B.} Hohenjohann of Grußglockner & a man J. T. Crowley with him. He had a long talk with Crowley. They had had a very heavy day on the Kofels ridge & had just come on Sunday the 2nd day, & were going over the Weißenbach to the Schloss Annabichl later tomorrow.

Jug 26. I slept at 6 & went alone to the Gepatsch Hause — Rauhkopf and 7 — Maranahorn seen from 7.35 - (Jug 7.50). Sopped for tea & from 8 - 8.30 Gepatsch Hause. 10. — I saw a couple of a new hut - Seehütte - with others along, but it was a Jagdhütte. After food I decided to go down, but I reluctantly packed up laundry & engaged a guide for the G. lock down. I went up & washed my stockings had a sleep & enjoyed a guide.

Jug 27 ^{Glockenhütte} got off 3.45, returned an sleds crossed bridge & ran up a steep narrow path thru trees at 4.30 we were at a snow level cap, opposite the junction of the Krummangstal back & the Riff back 4.50. Followed a good path with Way Marks. Opposite the Stein covered snow of the Riff stream in bullet 5.45 - 5.55 fine cracked & a little before the got to the snow 6.15 - 6.40 for food. The snow was a good place where we were on the top at 6.13

It was a glorious day & I was able to get - in my book to geography of the upper Innthal with the passes from Landeck to the Salzach - Meran & Switzerland. The Matter & the Samnaun that was first opposite he left at 8.40 & had 7. I continued up past the Stobenz alpen Hause. Had the top off 9.5 (-9.10). Delted on the flats above the junction of the K. & R. streams & had food to rest 10 - 10.30. The guide had some cows on the cap, they came up when he called them & he looked them over. In stead of going down the way he came off he went over hills & picked the new road with long zig zags so stories from the other side of the valley into & the Gepatsch basin when it went back he crossed to the stream at the head of the G. of the Gepatsch Hause & got high & cold up. We were back at 11.45 - I had tea & Noodle soup at 8.30 & did my clothes had lunch 1.30 paid the guide (Austrian money) & went down the high path 4.30 down, taking a cap of tea before it started. At Flecken we took permission, on the way down we had all to go up. While the river & snowed between 8pm & 9pm & two Hay carts & etc. trying to beat the change of play. I went to the Hotel Post at Landeck & put my luggage & took a pair of boots to be resolved. He had no license.

Jug 28 packed my luggage - with letters for my brother & myself & slow train 1.33 to Innsbruck (it took 2 hours). I went to the Savoia & took a room & then went to Wilten & got dinner at the Pension with my notes. At my bed end for an hour I did not sleep & know much about them. In the end I put them to far from the edge. I took a few things & then a thermometer came on & I had to shell it as my instrument was in the box. I took some presents as a keepsake.

Jug 29 I got a train to Hall at 8.30 & got there 9.5. The parish church is very curious. It has an aisle with N. side with three pillars & a few pillars in the center of the main aisle directly behind which is the high altar, a small platform - from the S. side leading up a narrow passage between it & most easily of the central pillar, outside a curving porch. (High altar) A virgin collection of processional robes & lanterns with gold wire work
