

Nov. 19 33

I then returned to the Hotel May baggage & went to the Station  
for the 4:31 train to Aragon. But I had <sup>time to get "gondola"</sup>  
arrived at the theater again. They had been told one time  
there was no way on the second row of seats where I wanted to sit  
in a gondola, but advised me to follow the path of the hill to the  
back. I walked up & got a photo of the theater from the  
topmost steps; but I thought I saw a way of getting on the  
second row where the position was better at the extreme rear.  
By climbing there (which I did) it was better at the extreme rear  
& barbed wire & all where I wanted to walk till an  
official who out of pity got to the center & took a  
photograph. They both said no. I took it & paid  
I got a coupon at 4:57 & went to the Louvre where  
I noted had recommended me.

Nov. 9. I slept well & got up about 7:30. It was still & cold wind blowing  
I sat at the station to pick up letters & then I got the S. D.Y.  
I walked round outside the Rempart from the station round to  
the bridge but saw no possible photos except the pine trees.  
<sup>Nov.</sup> I got one inside the Rempart & then one of Paul Beugot. Then I  
walked up the top of hill & went into the Cathedral - very dark & cold  
at the interior of the Chapel Palace. I came back to the Hotel for  
breakfast & went to sleep after it. I got a bill 2.15 & got some  
photos of the outside of the Palace & the fountain Paul Beugot; but the  
wind was very strong. I then continued by walk round Rempart &  
came back to the Porte Magaine & looked at the outside of St. Symphorien  
& St. Germain to the Hotel. The specimens were fine but windy.

Nov. 10. I got up in good time & went to Mass at 8. It was cloudy at first but  
the sun came out soon. I went up to the Chapel Palace - a magnificient  
fortress. One of the towers which being built - we fear of the English  
"fire companies" who were making themselves a name here in France.

After lunch I walked to Villeneuve & got an auto photo & got  
back about 4 hrs. I wrote letter & had a very bad night & cold bed.

Nov. 11 I went to St. Agnès, but there was no Mass at 8. A man on the door  
says Mass at 6:30 is always held & the 6 o'clock is certain, & bell will

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be rung at 7:45 to the last if there is mass. I had no bread tea & coffee so I was  
return to hotel. I went at about 8:30 & got a taxi from the Roches  
du Dom but it was a bad night. Long the Seine running  
there would be good view. I watched the ceremony after "Requiem-  
Ave Maris" A procession from the Place de l'Hotel de ville  
placing wreath. I got another photo from Rue Peyrolerie  
I also watched infant racing by ambulance with Place - Course Court  
& brought my luggage. After that I went to the museum  
but found it was closed all day for "repairs" I walked  
round the part of the Rempart I had before; came back  
had a cup of mad tea - & spill the rest of the water on the book  
& on the table, but did not do any real damage. Wrote  
diary, shaved, took bath & the plateau.

Nov. 12. I fell-sick the night before, & it was certain I had taken some  
food which had upset me - first. On lobster a Friday as dinner. I did  
not get up till 11, & had an omelette & some bread for dinner. In evening  
I had some chlorodyne with me. In the afternoon I went to the museum  
Cabinet. The collection of medieval iron work is very good. Then the  
Musée Lapidaire where I saw the "Dieux au maillet" but was  
unable to obtain a picture of it. somewhere they were standing  
of clouds of small balloons. I fell-sick well in the evening.

Nov. 13. I got up now at 8 & came to 10 o'clock and to Remoulins.  
I had a cup of coffee & then crossed the Suspension bridge & walked on the  
R bank of the river. The pedestrian walk but the Pard-de-fer road  
only comes in view at the last moment. By the right bank - the  
road when all heavy traffic is directed to Pard-de-fer & avoid the Suspension  
bridge it is with traffic for some time. But that is not until 6:30.  
about 7:30 (on R. bank) I followed path of which took us to the  
other side of the bridge & walk up. I took an auto & then followed  
the path down to the river. The best view is upstream <sup>down</sup> from a rocky bar.  
I returned to when I had left my auto & got a "petit pain", admiring the  
Colom & steps of the Pont - 369 m by 147 m 77 high. & buys water from  
the pure mountain across the Gave de Pau. It goes stage in 6 minutes to 20 m. 12 hrs.
