

The second tier has 11 arches & is 20 m. high & the third has 35 arches of 5 m. 53 high. It was built by Augustus in the year of Augustus. The stone has taken a wonderful golden weathering. I then went back to the top of the Agrippa. A tunnel has been made straight ahead & under the ground. The aqueduct itself has a sharp left. I followed along keeping to the right receiving straight back & came to the reservoir of it crossing a small ravine. The aqueduct is broken but it showed the construction & the detail of the 30 cm. thick. I followed the path along the ravine till it got to the tabular & followed it some way, then I got a little direction & took a small track to my left. We had to struggle across & down to the Roman. It is 100 m. from the start including both. I got down to the road at 1.55 & camped on the road at 2 for dinner. If I had gone on I should have got down to the road at 2. The scenery of the Sages & some olive & great vegetation & the purple & orange splendor of the vines & the few deciduous trees was so lovely.

I went to the Hotel Chateau de la Reine & dinner facing the Reine. I took two photos of the Reine & walked to the Maison Carrée & Pont-Augustin.

Nov. 14. Was to the Maison Carrée when it was on a train so I had to the Musée de l'Épiscopat. The most curious statue is a fine Roman figure statue of the good G. Resan. It stopped & led to I got back to the hotel & had lunch & as it rained up I set off with my cap & camera, & went first to the Fontaine part of which go back to Roman times. Then to the Temple of Diana, then up to the Street Nazaire. This was the promenade of the 50 tiers which originally existed. A Gallie tower of ~~stone~~ were made & then encircled the Caesars. The Caesars of I believe turned it into a strong hold, but it was pulled down under Henri IV in belief treasure was concealed in it. It is 30 m. high. It was too cloudy to walk of any to the top of the tower. I got 2 photos of the Maison Carrée built in the year 1 A.D. in honor of Caius & Lucius Caesar the adopted son of Augustus. It is considered the most beautiful of the R. remains in Gaul. Still quite recently it was called the Maison Caprotine - a corruption of Caprotina. It is 25 m 13 m x 12.29

20.5 km 57m 15 Steps Inside a good collection of statues etc. & a very fine collection of Gallie & Roman mosaic. Then to the Cathedral, St. G. de N. One of the altars has part of a 14th cent. Sarcophagus showing O. B. L. & the XII apostles. I then to the Basilica. The apse itself is an oval 13.2 m. 25 x 10.1 m. 40. Outside 33 m. 59 high. The open amphitheater - under a half-wing but blank wall - a soccer ground. I stayed on some time & as it got dark returned to the hotel & headed my coat.

Nov. 15. I got up at 6.30 & had to catch a train to look out the S. & N. S. but had no of the 10. did not start till 11. I spent a little at 9.17 & went off to the Aqueduct. In the Aqueduct getting there at 10.25. In some way it is very remarkable the Caracalla. The fine construction is very fine & well built. The stonework is finished of opening in the wall as the higher part of which I was could be dropped as the splash of the small window & niches on the arches. The tower stands off the walls & was built ^{part} of stone & a part when starting in the Crusade. His son Philip & Henri completed the justification in 1272 - It is said the walls followed the plan of Damietta. The tower Caesars is 37.20 m. high & the walls are 6 m. thick to the first floor. There is beautiful view Caesars which seemed a light house. It comes on to view slightly as I was round the walls for photos & then closed. I had lunch at the museum at 1.15 & set off to walk across the Champs. I followed the Canal for nearly 2 K. & got the road to my R. to St. G. de N. 13 K distant. A long road with houses - straight - fewer trees & trees. I got to the bridge at St. G. de N. at 4.15. I had to wear my cap for nearly an hour. It was then getting dark & I practically gave up all hope of finding the statues on the railway as they are really as hills. I did not dare take the short cut down the R. bank of the Petit-Rhône & was of the Parc de Sauvage the hotel is 2 K. distant. I stepped along a road in the dark with houses all round & the road winding in & out. I saw the tower I had hoped to catch one of the statues. The two I had they were 2.5 K & 1.2 K off the road. I found by Elvira had not accepted for the night.
