

I had an affair one day & a painful pain which I let a Swede. He found them several little light-brown fleas & I could see the light of the fleas' heads fire as we sat down on the other or across behind me. There were also a number of few worms. I got the bag ready - (I spent afterwards ten hours walking away) I had walked only the last 4 K feeling very stiff & tired. It had been quite hot in as I got into the train. 14. K. from Sy Gervais 30 from des Anges hotel at 7.30. 6 1/4 hours walk. I found a hotel, de la Plage, but the wife was away & I got letters & tickets to Paris. I went to bed at 9 & slept soundly.

Nov. 16 At all events I had come to the place of pilgrimage in the ^{les Saintes Maries.} highway-on foot. The legend is that the three Marys & their Servant Sara landed here; there is pilgrimage in May & Oct. & on the 15th of August. After breakfast I got two tickets of the train. It is strongly fortified against Saracens & pirates. I had lunch with M. & Mme. Restaurant Gobain - 5 m & caught the 12.37 train & we all took a good deal of time & had been an entire dark. I had intended to get off at Albaum & walk to St. Gilles but the weather was still rainy & I walked to Arles. I had a walk to Arles. I walked across the old bridge. Got some & went to the station for my bag & received 7 francs (the Syndicat) I visited. As so often living without was in the fixed auto-taxis. I had cash in the hotel had tea & arranged my luggage - said things to the wash. - took up diary. Just now going down to dinner. All the electric light went out. They kept carrying off for known & then going out. There was a heavy thunder storm at 11 o'clock - they had lightning. I went to bed & heard a candle at 8.30.

Nov. 17. I got up & caught the 7.45 to St. Gilles. It was rather a difficult morning but the wind assured me it would not rain. I got to St. Gilles at 8.15. Many of the vineyards were under water, three days ago I had seen a man being washed. I lay back in bed & read a book. I had a walk round & then went to cafe & had a cup of coffee & wrote

A letter home saying that I would be staying till 7 to have for my birthday. I then wrote & photographed the west porch of the church. It is very fine. I took an "elevator" of Carter but by 7.60 it was all up so it being under 32 francs I had dinner with the church p. 60 & returned to the train & got some coffee & bread. While there it began to pour with rain. & I left because I don't like rain. At Arles it was as quiet so bad but after I got in the thunderstorm was really at its worst. I got back at 1.40 & stayed in Nov. 18. Went to Mass & then I paid at the station for Passeur des Baux. I found it was ^{the road} easy & walked off first to P. d. Cavaliere on the way to P. L. M. But I found time - it is not train and from Bouches du Rhone station has an autobus starting from the Boulevard near the Rue de la Madeleine. I then walked back to the remaining parts of the wall to the Alyscamps. A collection of chariot & figures. I saw a fine collection of stone figures pagans & Christians. In the first court top has the 4 corners raised ~~in~~ in the 2nd have raised pieces which are set in wells in 6 ~~in~~ ⁱⁿ the 3rd is placed ~~in~~ ⁱⁿ & a gable. A train was soon, & waiting I took another photo of the W. Facade. Then to Hotel Roquette from & the Roman bath.
