

New Zealand 1854

- Thurs. Dec 6 Got car from Hermann & friend W., buy 10 several strings & started down after dinner. Called at Leavenworth Mess. Mess (D. Clephus's son-in-law). The last in the road has been great confusion. I got 1. Ross about 4.30 & found horses lame in the same place but rebuilt 20m.
- Fri. Dec. 7. We were very little aged & the same old Hermann. A delicate friend & am. Called on him & remained a few hours & took dinner at the Waikato, a large settlement now. 24 m.
- Sat. Dec. 8 Walked 4 miles, cutting back my trail & secured pipe, the price a day first, fitting the two pieces, passing so the horse are at Picky Creek. Saw hot May (Bessie Chisholm) two sheep named others, prettier & younger with Hermann's sheep to be dead in front of R.C. Side of walk & had a good many stones.
- Sun. Dec. 9. The church at Ross is now on the hill near the school. I took the school celebration & then I went to Ruatoria for a 9.30 celebration. Quite a good congregation. Hermann came with me. One of the Grey Wilson from Ross is the pres. Standing. I left after dinner. Drove home Herbie & John & Ferguson. Senns at 7.30.
- Mon. Dec. 10. A rainy night, but coming back took his & Ruatoria home. I walked in the car passing the school & the end of the back road flat under the water was much used. Mick Collett came in the evening.
- Tues. Dec. 11. The rain began about 7. am & continued till midday almost solid falling. I did odd jobs in the car & helped wash plants in the wash & after dinner called on Mr. Potts & Mr. Mich. Would have remained in the evening packed & fitted up things, Captain Green called on Sam Mitchell at 5.30pm & Mr. John & Mr. Ferguson, George was out this day & the Waikato fishing. No luck, back at 8.15

Thurs. Dec. 13. got off at 9, found the bush round the Waikato bridge much broken up & very fine. Very difficult to get across the road with all the new horses. Saw Harold Heude, Russ, his horses having Rite a part. - Charlie Shearer. Belle Ferguson (now Johnson) Harry Orman. Then the bistro. Mrs. Charlie Anderson at the Ferry. He was also bus-
y Cook. Price in 1806 Y. & D. aged 100. Saw Harris James & Billie. Called at the forks 4.30 the walk about 5.15. Found Alice & Peter. 72 m.

Fri. Dec. 14 Walked up to Linton & ran it & W. Crossed my fort. Took car which they had the speed is bad nothing but hills & roads. Surface & driving was so bumpy.

Sat. Dec. 15 Up to Mt Sperry & very tiring went with me. but for the bus. Back down the big hills.

Sun. Dec. 16 H.L. 7.30 arranged luggage, dinner in, slept. The electric light failed. Evening 8.15 in deep darkness.

Mon. Dec. 17. ^{Capt. Harden} Walked up the glacier with Captain - highest in view of evening he returned for lunch as his wife was not well. I had lunch at the glacier, it was on the ice slightly. I got back for tea. Some one had used a bath that was disconnected, water & water tank did not work it. A proper collection of waste came down in the trough while we were having coffee. When the walls were dried off with blotting paper & turpentine mopped up. The least damage was done.

Tues. Dec. 18 Walked up to Parih Point & crossed the river from Suspension bridge & up Heude's track - a very fine piece of walk, he was beginning it when Blue & I came down in 1807. The track is very beautiful. I had lunch on a small creek ^{below} the river bank & crossed the Suspension bridge but as it was out I returned & went down the rocks the water side of the bridge & got on the ice. At first I had to get up the glacier & then got a good run down & got off at the creek & got back at 4.15.

Wed. Dec. 19 Weather can't OK until the road for the traps is very bad at first but they are widening & improving the road. I saw the people at the village
