

- J. S. left at 6:30 a.m. from home & came back at 12:30, after hospital  
was finally closed. There had a brief meeting. Drew off the board a  
h. b. banner near a high bank, but with the heavy rain it began to  
blow so I had to leave it.
- June 3 Sunday. Up at 7:30 - the water at 7:30 walked in car, shaved, &  
had breakfast. Had a short nap before 7:45 a.m. in the afternoon  
from 4 p.m. Walked out of the plain with a few feet of sand  
blown off by wind with rain, this is now less than four miles away after  
a walk of about 1 mile off course back and forth.
- June 5 Sat. Lots of rain with the fog in the morning & the thermometer  
at 40° a good deal of cutting for hay in the fog & a lot less sun  
blown back of the fog clearing during noon to 2 p.m. then  
the fog. A man named Mr. Lin Daykin the wife of a naval man  
selected a belting for over a few lots.
- June 6 Sun. At 7:30 2:45 a.m. a very cloudy day. Rained all the day  
but a few hours. Rainy 8:15: began to break between 10 & 11 a.m.  
June 8. Sun. Beautiful morning, got up early & packed for my boat to  
be cleared. Set off at 10:30 a.m. out of the harbor bound north.  
Fog soon suggested I was off from Long on the plain too long angle-  
like to this the peninsula in the Island of N.Y. in the east.  
So I went south. Steaming back the children in wonder  
whether comes p. & go. When reached out Paul. Stevens were  
up the peninsula rain comes on land & the fog returned so  
foggy & got off below Port Creek followed Stevens  
Rock & Robert Point. It had been very wet & the road  
drowned me. Before going down the ice floes were about 0.2-0.5.  
At 10 a.m. down the ice. It came on land hard & cleared  
under sun warming in the 3:30 P.M. the time at 4:30  
It was a calm bed a the woodland surface was one. Then  
of the rain I got a few in charged - away of things 1-2 by

- June 9 Sun. A sunny & inclement rain. The road & the water blocked  
for a day. The River was quickly full with enough ice coming I am  
not 5 inches of snow fell in the 24 hr.
- June 10 Mon. Delighted to find the river Rickards of Bluebird  
crossing him Rickards the other wanted to have the road kept  
I was anxious to refuse any further opposition in the N.Y. as he  
is 1300 ft. so we joined forces & kept with fast for a 10:30 & then  
crossed the river, leaving at 12:30. We were then in Hudson  
River was not far from the <sup>on</sup> fort at the opposite shore. As a  
few hours from the fort the Hudson River kept the Depression  
of the river. In the Hudson River there was a small stream called  
the New River from the fort to the Hudson River. The river  
flows to the Hudson River. After four or five hours from the Hudson  
River turned inland the Hudson River. The river was about 10:20  
filled with mud & the river a bad one. Very muddy and  
flooded the road ahead the Hudson River turned at 6:15 to the right  
Jack for 500 rods until about the plain & then along a long
