

Jan 23 ran we in the car to the Vancouver, I saw nothing of them & left the rest to say I would be back at 3. On the way back one of the warden said they thought they had heard skunk in the ^{of creek} creek so I kept blowing my horn & stopping to listen I stopped on the bridge when car came behind me, so I hurried on & got to the bank at 1.40 & a few seconds later a private car came in which had picked them up at the U. S. bridge camp. Gen. Drown & his wife whom I had used on the Peninsula passed thru on their way to the Fox. Lieut. Galt who was in command of the N. 2. force in the war is staying in the hotel. I brought ^{negatives} ~~photos~~ down to the car & left it on the dinner table of my table as I had wanted an enlargement & forgot it & the maid destroyed it. It was one of David Richardson & Jack Cox on the glacier, I thought she might like. After dinner he did my case.

Jan 24. I am. A very wet morning. It came out quite fine about 10, & I took Knig & the Vicar of Hobbet & his daughter Margaret & he found some Starks up on the ice & he had some good sled cutting at the summit. They came in the hotel of Drown & after that he was to be because of Hagen. I had asked him to see my glasses & he told me the tie rod was holding of half a team.

Jan 25. Fri. S. Paul. A perfect day. Knig took the celebration as it was his younger daughter Pauline's birthday. Only they were present.

Jan 26. Sat. I was off of car to Heri Heri. I called at Frank Gunn's & cousin and the boy. Mr. Gunn had good reports. I had lunch with them. It had been raining steadily & continued. I was on to the V. L. W. wayami & saw the Robinsons & the Grahams & stopped with Bill Well. 46m

Jan 27. Sunday. I took the celebration at Heri Heri & Mr. Bill Search. I got off of the car with Jack & Drown who seemed very fit. The creek of Meichain was rising up with respect of the rain which still continued. On the glacier end of Mt. Heri I saw a timber log upside down over the side. It was man had been in it & in so wearing it around a man's cycle they got too near the edge & the road gave. Now if the man were really dead, the sled chain had saved them. It was evidence the fault of the man's cycle. 1

I went a day to the Glacier & took service at 2.30 & back to Hatterly of the & then back to bank for my & small boy that was directed in the road. I got in at 5 & changed & took service at 8.15 - very tired. I went to the office & did not bed till 11 46m

Jan 28. Mon. A fine day, a man Dick Hagen an engineer at the office who is been photographer & climber wanted to climb the mountain & he took Jack Cox & myself & Paul Churchill to his way of food. He said would have to return, I persuaded David Richardson to come & return via the glacier. He also packed into my car & piled the things on the car. I drove down. I was wearing the large sled trimmer nails & I found that they kept locking when I was decelerating & change gear. Hagen kept his sled. In the dark they turned to the side of the old rim and I left the car under a log & walked up to the rim head. Across the suspension bridge & had lunch 1.30 - 2.15 - got off the car at 3.30 & had 10 min. rest; then up to the summit. There is no danger enough but nothing like it. I used to be. I got to the head of the debris at 4.10 & left at 4.20. He crossed the glacier & was on the rocks at the foot of the creek 4.55 - 5.10. He called to his partner and got enough sled of 1803-477 5.30 - 5.40 & got to the Chumalla Ridge at 6.20 Frank Black will come with Knig & his boys & D. Drown & the organizers of A. C. Cathedral had come for the car with Joe Hagen & Charlie Parry. The Chumalla Ridge had been the for some & the Fox Hotel has erected a bar & a table & a table at the head of Pioneer Ridge, they climb first right & change their residence at the Hotel 257 - had a night for use of the bar. He had long & small car & fly with us. The night did not look too good. 18m

Jan 29. Tues. Frank Clark set off with his party in the dark, we had back to bed as it was raining. He passed the day sleeping & eating. A little better in the evening. A Hea stopped in D. Drown's.

Jan 30. Off at 7, with a fair moon. I got off at 4.30. At Point A. All was different - no snow on the trail route & a very compressed piece of ice with a lot of the end instead of a snow gully & on his sled. He got to the work at the end of Pioneer Ridge at 8.30 & went to look at the old camp & returned some of the old nails & two lead poles. He had food & David Richardson & Paul left at 8.45 - I was nearly out of the glacier, he was up also - no problem
