Mar. 10. Sun. Had a very bad night with 5 ticks & was difficult in getting dressed. Did not get to the very celebration, said nothing & went to the 11 o'clock at St. Michael's. Called at Richards & found the British & the best water away. I had to go & try of the 5 am. Reg. Gibson came with tea. Called at Ruth Kuttanoff at 8:30 but found no one at

Mar. 11. Mon. Got up & went to the Cathedral. I stayed to the celebration at 8 & had dinner at 7:30. Went shopping in the morning called on Hammering. Saw Hawthorn in the afternoon. Ruth Kuttanoff & her friend came to dinner. Went out to Mitchell later on.

Mar. 12. Tues. Went to the Cathedral at 7:30. My car which had been the church was & the lamp was damaged & Coughlan's boy in the back was killed. I was at 10. Bought a few things. Got car. Saw Hawthorn. Called at the house of the friends of his called Warrington who had a boat on the lake. In the afternoon we took the car down to the boat in the water. It had been newly laid but was leaking & got out. We took her down to the other bank, her car 3/4 mile up the lake & walked back to the car had a drink of tea & returned

Mar. 13. Wed. Hawthorn & I were called at 6 & went down to the Rabin's house. A his boat was for 7:30 am we had intended to use the Warrington's boat, but called D. Jellott. Gave us a lift down. The dragon was low & had to be let down & lifted. There were about 20 but when we got down we saw one man catch a 26 lb salmon but there was very little being done. I had work up to practice casting off the reel with the heavy lead & spin. Neither Hawthorn nor I got a fish. He returned & had his with the doctor & came back to the Warrington.

Mar. 14. Thurs. He was off at 7 with Warrington & one of his sisters, they stayed at the N. side

and in a boat across to the South side. There was 29 on the side & 6 on the North side & there were in boats. There was a few more but I did not see any. I saw one several times, but it was too far out for me to reach & I could not use the boat as I had no off. None of us caught anything to be sent home from there & got back at 4.

Mar. 15. Fri. Hawthorn & I went off to the north. I was lucky and I caught a fish but I think they are very sluggish. Hawthorn jugged him for me. It came in very cold & slight rain, so we returned for lunch after lunch we packed & came back to Christchurch. I stayed at the Federal & Hawthorn at the McFarlane's. I did some shopping & finding the place remained open till 9 on Friday, I was able to get a good many things after dinner I had a talk with Mitchell. I found out that I had been able to arrange for the two lectures I had promised to the A.S. & the C. & C. Council. Continued till 11.

Mar. 16. Sat. After getting some maps & a wax in steam things I got out by 6:30. I picked up a bag for Mr. Hawthorn who had been staying at the North side Beach with Warrington his grand children. I was observing the lake. I got up for lunch & in the afternoon I got out in a broken windscreen. 39 m

Mar. 17. Sun. I was in celebration of the little church. Said nothing - preached for Hawthorn with afternoon with letters. Peter & I had some more conversation with the children & stayed till night.

Mar. 18. Mon. Another very hot day. With letters made a promise of the photos for repairing. Finished repairing each screen of car. Serranus left.

Mar. 19. Tues. Rain in the night. At 12:30 a luggage 1.6 all I could save things I sent to Christchurch from Christchurch. Heard of two friends of Hawthorn being drowned at the mouth of the Hurunui crossing 5 in 14 ft. boat with a motor without attendants.

Mar. 20. Wed. Finished packing, finished car, altered rod handle, drove up the Warrington valley & back to the Warrington.

Mar. 21. Thurs. up 6:30 finished breakfast 8:30. Said good bye to Hawthorn, drove to Ch. Ch. Called on Mr. Warrington. Ch. Ch. 12. Stopped at Federal saw Mitchell & got a good collection of slides, some came from the fish from Dunedin & Hazel sent some to her mother for me. Spent all afternoon sorting them, just got finished as Mitchell came in for dinner 29
