May 10. Fri. Woke up 5:30 got up & had bath, & we were just

we had breakfast 7:30. I got away soon after 9. & went off  
with the team. I wondered how long it was a line through the

I then walked out toward Waikeiki got a cup of coffee  
An American engineer gave me a lift & showed me  
the new reclaimed furage. I then walked on again  
& got. Sun level at Deane for 45c, very good. Then  
a again & had look at the fake native village &  
at the 300, both from. The American was  
kind. interesting. The wind blew & green head of sun  
after small fish were washed. I took a team back  
& walked about a bit & got back to the boat at 2:15 & had tea  
she sailed at 3:45. Took tea photo of Diamond Head.

May 11. Sat. a fine morning with h.c.s. did some word puzzles. read J. J. J. J.  
num 315  
moved by chair (the upper deck. went to the pictures in  
the evening. got ready for the celebration tomorrow

May 12. Sun. Took a celebration at 7. 9 present. went to the 11 o'clock  
num 390  
after the King's accession & seemed afraid of Americans.  
Anselmond beautiful day this it was rather cold on deck.

May 13. Mon. A dull morning, we fell the cold for a good week the maximum  
num 386  
temperature had been 84. 1 of course much better below. yesterday it was max  
69. I left in the morning & again after lunch. went to pictures with  
evening. left Honolulu the clock had been fast for 18 min a day  
now it is 24 so we are making more time. I believe in evening.

May 14. Another dull day. The temperature yesterday was max 68 min 59  
num 385  
I left - both morning & afternoon. once a line with a pair will  
decided to go on to Vancouver. Arranged about luggage &  
decided to get luggage tomorrow & speak for a month

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May 15. Another cool day max 59 min 53. The weather much  
num 389  
the same. A slight drizzle all morning. Arranged my luggage  
left after lunch, but the rain began to come in on me  
went to picture in evening. Better than usual as they were all  
"interesting." I had been in to see Bureau & with evening Jell-  
on if I had a cold. I could not shut the cabin window & it was  
very cold. However I was able to collect the blankets from the other  
boat.

May 16. Tues. Another miserable day. Yesterday the temperature had been max 59  
num 379  
& min 49. Clocks were advanced 54 min. I put on night with  
Pacific side since the night was short. The cold did not seem  
to be bad I took some more old cases. I packed cabin trunk & deck  
chair & sent them to my L-Boatman room. After lunch we saw  
high land to the eastward. part of Washington O.S.A. We are now in  
101 April about 7. When we shall complete our run from Honolulu 2345 mi.

I had to get a laundry ticket & then went to see & took a team up  
to the town & bought some tobacco & some fish, & got back about 8:30  
& saw about my luggage checking these things across to the boat  
& got my ticket for the ship. I found that the vessel was the  
Dechen of Redford and the Dechen of Richmond.  
I found some letters & had to Bureau two of them.  
I then finished packing as far as I could & retired in.

May 17. Fri. Woke at midnight we set off for Vancouver got in  
about 6. Breakfast was 7:30. I got off about 9 & changed  
some money & took my luggage to the Customs & got my receipts  
for the 5 Copeys for Bauff for fuel. It was chilly & cold  
I did some shopping, had lunch at the Hudson Bay Store. Caught  
the 2:45 train for Vancouver. The wind spring & rain  
struck me very much. It was very cloudy & some rain. I left  
at 4:30. I had 2 min at 6, at 7 we saw the Hell Gate  
bridge. The P.P.R. runs on the N. Bank of the Fraser, the  
C.N.R. on the South Bank. The coast is just as on the N.
