Saturday Carting Peas this afternoon
The Germans join to Africa

Monday Rather dull looking this morning
nine o'clock Mass this morning
one of my sheep is at Spence's old marina
Daisey machine cuts well food article

Monday Raining lightly this morning
of some peas - & partly out - yet

Raining big this afternoon
= peas not finished yet
= Raining very heavy to night

Tuesday 9 Rather dull looking this morning
Dan pulling straw = Sanders stacks -

etc = doing pretty well
