Library Rules as Amended. After considerable discussion the following Rules for the Management of the Library, were finally agreed to, as then amended.

Rules.

For the Management of the Library of the Christchurch Mechanics Institute.

- 1 Every Member when required to do so by an Officer of the Institute shall produce his card of Membership.
- 2 All new books shall remain a month on the library table before circulation, and no number of any periodical shall be allowed to circulate until the succeeding number has been received.
- 3 Not more than one Volume or one Number of any work shall be issued to any member at one time; except by special permission of the Librarian.
