Cab Fares.

To be charged for any Carriage Plying for Hire at any place within Ten Miles of the Post Office.

HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

One or Two Adults to be a full fare.

FARES BY TIME.

	S. D.
1. For any time not exceeding one hour	4 0
2. For every subsequent fifteen minutes or less	1 0
3. In case of a Carriage licensed to carry more than two passengers one fourth extra to be charged for each adult carried more than two.	
4. When the passenger is not set down at the place of hiring, time is to be reckoned for returning at the rate of five miles an hour from the place of setting down.	

FARES BY DISTANCE.

1. From any place within the City Boundary to any other place within the City Boundary	1 0
N.B.—The Railway Station (Goods and Passenger) to be deemed for this purpose to be within the City Boundary.	
2. For every mile or part beyond the City Boundary	1 0
3. For every fifteen minutes' detention at one time	1 0
4. In case of a Carriage licensed to carry more than two passengers, one half extra for every adult carried more than two.	
5. When the passenger is not set down at the place of hiring, half fare to be allowed back to the City Boundary for any distance exceeding two miles from the City Boundary.	

GENERAL.

For hiring a Carriage and not further employing the same	1 0
One half the above fares extra to be charged between 10 o'clock p.m. and 6 o'clock a.m.	
Luggage not exceeding 14lbs. in weight for each person carried to be included in above fares.	
Drivers to drive at six miles an hour unless unavoidably delayed, or required by the hirer to drive slower.
