AMENDMENT TO
OPERATION ORDER
No. 1

Reference Operation Order No. 1 dated 19th. April 1915
Para. 17 (1):- Erase " These flags will be carried -----
to the covering ships" and substitute "These flags will
ordinarily be carried or planted in position to indicate
to the Navy the position of our Troops; when Naval
covering fire is required to cease i.e. when such fire is
being directed on to a position it is desired to assault
the flags will be waved in such a manner as to be visible
to the covering ships or observing Officer".
The use of these flags is to be clearly explained to the
Officers carrying them.

TELEPHONE
EQUIPMENT

Units in possession of Telephone Equipment must be

telephones or expended cable for a considerable time.

GROUND SHEETS
AND BLANKETS

It has been decided that Ground Sheets only will be taken
ashore for the pending operations.
Unit arrangements will be made for storing the blankets
on the Transports.
The baggage wagons thus set free will be landed with
Echelon C. and incorporated in the Supply Section of the
Train.

SEVEN DAYS
LANDING SUPPLIES

The seven days ~~in~~ landing rations are to be unloaded
immediately after disembarkation of animals and vehicles
of Echelon B i.e. during the second visit of the Transport
to anchoring berths off the landing.
Lighters or Horse Boats will be available and the rations
are to be loaded into these with the utmost expedition.

OFFICER'S SERVANTS

(1) Officer's servants will accompany or follow sick
or wounded Officers to the Casualty Clearing Stations or
Hospital and see that the Officer's Kit is duly delivered
there.

On arrival, the servant will report himself to the Medical
Officer in charge and ask for instructions.

(2) The Medical Officer will decide whether the servant
is to remain or rejoin his Unit, and will give him written
instructions either

(a) to report to the proper authority for
accomodation, rations, and discipline and
for orders as to visiting the Casualty
Clearing Station or Hospital or

(b) to report for orders as to rejoining his
Unit.

(3) An Officer's servant will not be detained at the
Casualty Clearing Station or Hospital, except for urgent
reasons, and will not, on any account be allowed to
proceed to Egypt or England.
