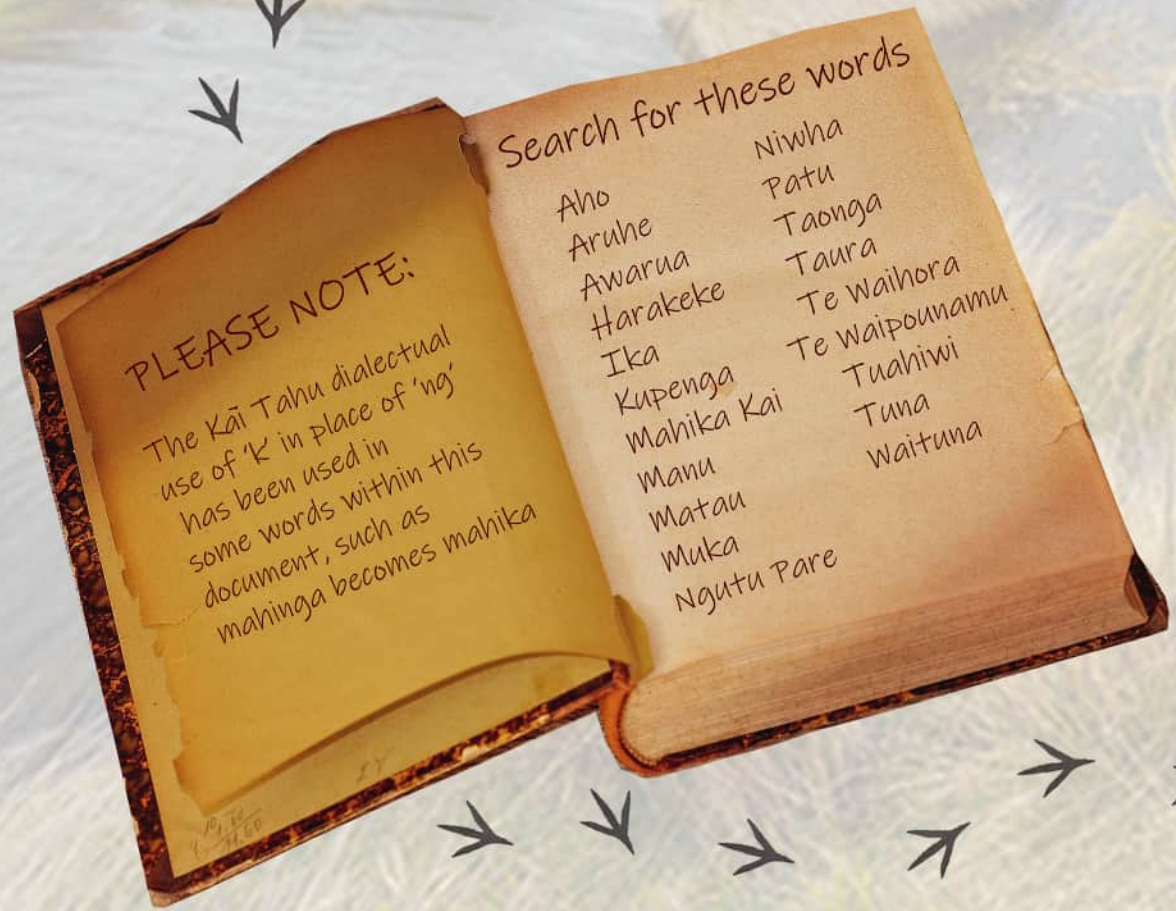

Tapaina ngā kūkūwai

Waituna

- \*One of the largest wetlands in Aotearoa/NZ
- \*Located near Awarua in Murihiku
- \*One of the best remaining examples of a natural coastal hāpua/lagoon
- \*The hāpua is home to a wide range of fish, bird and plant species

Te Nohoka a Tukiauau

- \*A hāpua/lagoon located on the Taiari/Taieri Plains
- \*It was an important mahika kai source for the people of Ōtākou
- \*It is part of Sinclair Wetlands
- \*The hāpua was returned to Ngāi Tahu in 1998

Te Waihora

- \*It is one of NZ's most polluted lakes
- \*It is the largest roto/lake in Te Waipounamu/South Island
- \*The restoration project 'Whakaora te Waihora' started in 2011
- \*It is known for its pātiki/flounder and tuna/eel

Tūtaepatu

- \*A hāpua/lagoon on the coastline north of Ōtautahi-Christchurch
- \*Tuna was one of the principle kai/food gathered there
- \*Declared a Wildlife Reserve in 1973
- \*The hāpua is part of Tūhaitara Coastal Park
