What's coming up in the Learning Centre

Matariki

Each year Christchurch City Libraries offer a variety of events, programmes and craft activities to celebrate Matariki and to learn more about this important part of Māori culture.

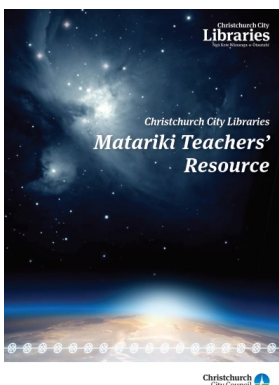
During term two the Learning Centres will be delivering Matariki Connect sessions. Students will learn about the Māori new year and the cultural significance of the Matariki star cluster. Matariki stories, celebrations and traditions will be explored.

This year at Christchurch City Libraries, the theme for Matariki is maumaharatanga - remembrance. Students will learn about the Māori New Year, explore images of historic Ngāi Tahu leaders and learn about the importance of understanding our past. Students will take part in an engaging activity using quality library resources and produce a unique artwork about maumaharatanga. This is a wonderful opportunity to learn more about Te Ao Māori (The Māori world).

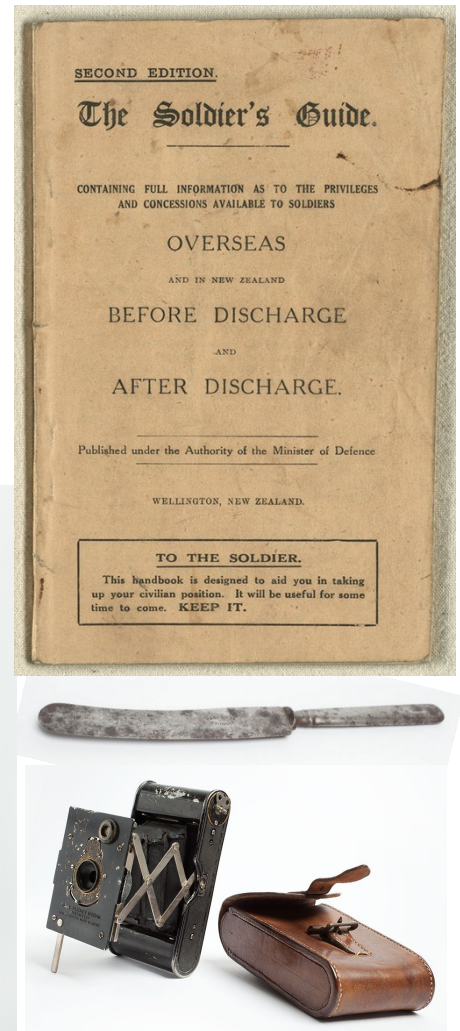

Horizons: The First ANZAC Soldiers

With the remembrance of WW1, students researched and presented information about soldiers who served our country and explored what it was like to be an ANZAC soldier. Soldiers were selected from roll of honour boards, family or from Christchurch City Libraries resources. The course was introduced by Barry O'Sullivan – local historian and WW1 collector. This set the scene for the next five weeks for students to explore the life of a soldier before the war, at war, and after the war. Their findings were presented to the whole class through Powerpoint using images and maps.

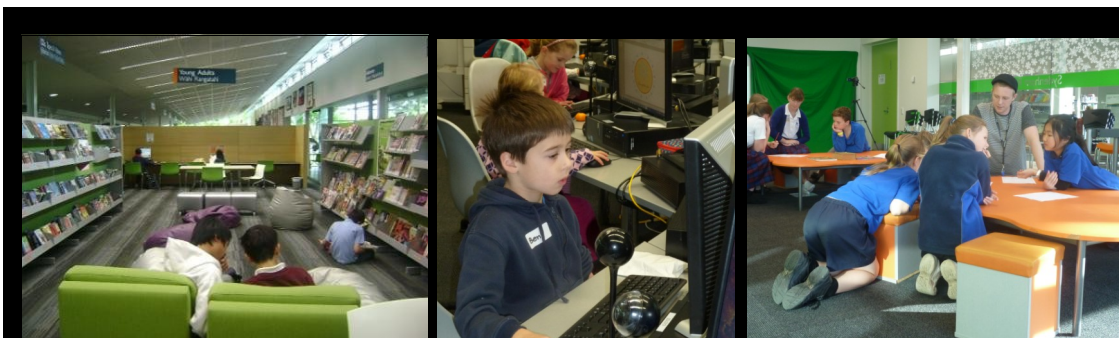

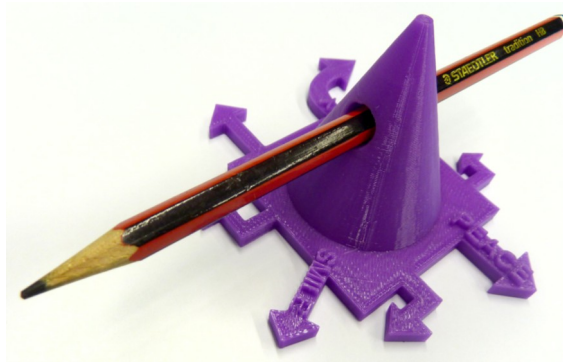
What else we have happening in term two 2015...

From 2D to 3D

This was very successful programme run with students from Opawa, Discovery 1, St Peters and Mt Pleasant schools in term four 2014. They learnt a lot and one student even wished that it ran all year—a sure sign of success!

Students will learn different aspects of 3D design: such as using Sketch Up to design key rings, Hama Beads to create their favourite characters, Print Craft to design their own buildings and 123D to design and print 3D items, as well as electronics to make a Redstone light.
